
A WEARY WORLD: Introduction

It's about honoring our weary hearts in a weary world and traveling the road of Advent as honestly as we can on a quest for hope and strength." The author also begins by reflecting on the words from the well-known Christmas hymn "O Holy Night". Think about the words to this song that has been with us for ages- "A Thrill of Hope, the Weary World Rejoices."
