+ *“My bounden duty is to love Christ, to worship God every Sunday in His church, and to work, pray, and give for the spread of his kingdom!”*

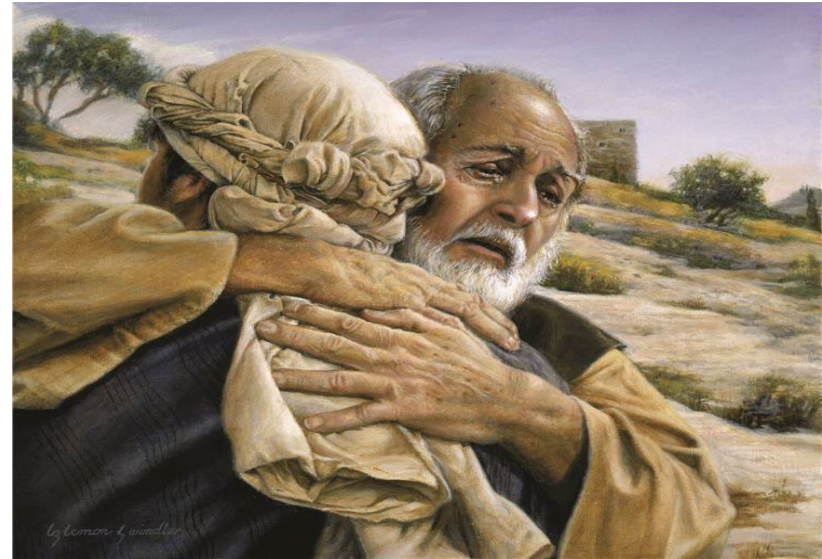
