PRINCIPAL'S REPORT: Mr. Meyers

Good morning everyone,

I hope you all had a wonderful vacation. While my trip to the Carolinas was unfortunately canceled, it allowed me to stay home and relax a bit.

I would like to share a few important updates:

Staffing Update

Ms. Alfred has officially retired, and we sincerely thank her for her incredible 26 years of service to RL. Mr. Levine will be serving as our Enrichment and Project B substitute teacher for the remainder of the school year. He previously worked at Willits, and we are excited to have him join us. The students love him, and we are very happy to welcome him to our community.

Mr. Levine will work with grades 3–5 and provide enrichment support. If a child is in Project Beyond, teachers may coordinate with Mr. Levine for other enrichment opportunities.

Birthday Celebrations & Food Guidelines

We want to address concerns regarding food and snacks in our school, particularly during birthday celebrations and school-wide parties (Halloween, holidays, Valentine's Day, and end-of-year events).

While family-provided food items have been a success, they have placed a significant burden on Ms. Ocuto, our school nurse, and classroom staff due to food allergies and safety concerns. Because of this, we are making an adjustment:

- For the remainder of this school year, food **will still be allowed** at the final two holiday parties. This will not change this year, though it may be revisited next year.
- For birthday celebrations, we will be transitioning from food items to **non-food items** (such as small favors) due to extreme food allergies and the extensive work required to ensure student safety.

We absolutely still want to celebrate our students. For grades K–5, each child's birthday will be announced, and they will receive a pencil and sticker from the principal. We must remain

mindful of classrooms with strict food restrictions and prioritize the safety of all students.

Please remember: if you are ever unsure about a policy or situation, come to me directly. Everything we do aligns with district guidance, and teamwork is essential.

Grade-Level Considerations

Some grade levels cannot have food at all due to high-level allergies, while 5th grade does not currently have those restrictions. It is important to me that we continue traditions our 5th graders have enjoyed. I want them to graduate and celebrate the end of the year appropriately, including food items at their parties when possible.

At Polar Express, no cookies were served, but I want to assure the school community that we will continue to work through these concerns thoughtfully. Our PTA has done an excellent job supporting our students, and I do not want to alter long-standing 5th grade traditions unnecessarily.

We are responsible for the safety and well-being of over 500 children. I will continue working closely with Ms. Ocuto to ensure we follow the correct procedures and policies so we can finish the school year strong and safely.

Nominating Committee to introduce roles: (Melissa reads the following):

- *The Co-President plays a key role in making important decisions for the PTA. They help oversee events, create committee chair lists, develop a manageable budget, and address potential challenges. The Co-President also leads all PTA meetings and attends Council Meetings. This esteemed position comes with many benefits, including building meaningful relationships with teachers, administrators, and parents across the Syosset School District. Additionally, it offers the incredible opportunity to play a significant role in bringing valuable programs to the school—an experience that is truly priceless.

- * The Treasurer is responsible for managing all financial aspects, including handling checks, banking, audits, and budgeting.

- * Vice Presidents serve as a vital support system for their committees, providing ideas, assisting at events, finding solutions, and acting as a liaison between the committee, administration, and PTA policies and regulations.

- * Our Corresponding and Recording Secretaries handle much more than reading and writing. They are responsible for managing meeting agendas, minutes, emails, calendars, and the website. These are two separate roles.

The most unknown role is that of the Council Delegate.

- * A Council Delegate is a committee member responsible for implementing programs across all schools in the district. While our PTA collaborates with the principal to approve ideas and programs, the Council works directly with the superintendent and district administration. As a Council Delegate, you are required to attend a monthly Council Delegate meeting as well as a meeting for your assigned committee. Examples of committees include the Annual District Election and Budget Vote, Communications Conference, Cultural Unity, Curriculum Enrichment, Parent Resource Group, and many more. If elected, you can request placement on a specific committee, though assignments are not always guaranteed.

These roles are the driving force behind the PTA, ensuring everything runs smoothly. They also serve as the face of the PTA, representing it at various events and always being present when financial transactions occur, such as at boutiques, carnivals, and book fairs. The PTA could not operate as efficiently without their dedication and hard work.

So PLEASE, we encourage you to consider submitting your name for an Officer or Delegate position. Nomination forms and deadlines are available online. If you wish to continue in your current role, please submit your intent to renew for a second term to be considered for re-nomination.
