

TODAY'S PERFORMERS

DR. BARBARA BAIRD, organist at First Congregational Church, Eugene, has been a member of the University of Oregon music faculty since 1988, teaching organ, harpsichord, and piano. An active recitalist since 1971, Baird has performed throughout the United States as well as Argentina, Brazil, Europe and Australia. A frequent adjudicator and clinician, she regularly conducts workshops and master classes for keyboardists, particularly on Baroque and Classical Period Performance, and Keyboard Pedagogy. Baird has been a presenter and recitalist at both national and regional conventions of the American Guild of Organists, and for the Southeastern Historical Keyboard Society, the Western Early Keyboard Association, the Organ Historical Society, the Historical Keyboard Society, the Oregon Bach Festival, several chapters of the American Guild of Organists, and for piano teachers' guilds in the United States and Australia. She is particularly known for her presentations on organ manual and pedal techniques for beginning organists, as well as New Organist workshops.

RICHARD GUY has been a church organist for 70 years, playing in several denominations. He is currently organist at the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Eugene. He sang for years in the Eugene Concert Choir, and presently plays harpsichord in several baroque ensembles, and leads the Emerald Chamber Orchestra which specializes in baroque cantatas and similar pieces. He is a semi-retired professional audio design engineer.

ERIC MCKIRDY was born in Eugene, grew up in Albany, studied organ with Dr. Barbara Baird what seems like 100 years ago now, and now lives in South Salem. He has been music director and organist at Albany First United Methodist Church since 2008, and also enjoys teaching a small collection of organ students. Eric serves on the Organ Media Foundation board of directors, and maintains the AGO Eugene chapter web site. In his free time, he works as a product manager for Driveway.com.

When DAN RINNAN was 14, Pastor Hasselquist lifted him up to the organ bench and told him to play (yes, it was possible then). All those pedals and stops were intimidating, and Dan wasn't sure about that; not until Cheryl, his secret teenage crush, at a school assembly sang "Oh Danny boy, the pipes, the pipes are calling." Dan studied organ with Anton Heiller, a long time ago in a galaxy far away.

DUANE SOUBIROUS is a first-year graduate student at the University of Oregon studying organ performance with Barbara Baird. Originally from the Bay Area, he began taking piano lessons at age 9 and added the organ at age 13 with Angela Kraft Cross. In 2019 he graduated from Oberlin College with a BA in history, having previously studied organ with Jack Mitchener at the conservatory there. Duane is currently the organ scholar at St. Mary's Episcopal in Eugene and serves on the board of the Eugene AGO chapter as member-at-large.

BRAD SCHULTZ serves on the staff at First United Methodist Church in Eugene as organist, pianist, choir director, interim handbell director, and as Artistic Director of Concerts at First. He is also the rehearsal accompanist for the Eugene Concert Choir and serves as Dean of the Eugene chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Brad is completing a dissertation towards a PhD in musicology at the University of Oregon. His dissertation examines the keyboard works of 16th-17th century Amsterdam composer Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck through lenses of rhetoric and embodied cognition.

MATT SCHULTZ is a senior marketing consultant for KVAL-TV Channel 13 in Eugene, and host of "Lifestyle Matters," a local interest show that airs in the sweet spot right after the 9am news and right before The Price Is Right. Highlights of his storied media career span interviews with Justin Bieber, P!nk, Aerosmith, Josh Groban and Kathy Griffin to notifying the northeast Iowa radio-listening public to be on the lookout for loose cows. When asked to reflect upon his three years as host of Pipescreams, Matt replied, "What a great way to work off community service."

The EUGENE AREA CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN GUILD OF ORGANISTS was chartered in 1952 with a desire to bring about renewed interest and appreciation for the pipe organ. Its membership of 30-35 members maintain a program calendar that includes workshops, presentations, and performances on fine instruments in the south Willamette valley. Regular offerings to the community includes *Pipescreams*, a halloween member's recital to raise funds for organ related programing on local radio, *King of Instruments*, an informative program that shows how a pipe organ works, and an annual *Lenten Recital series*. The chapter has hosted two regional AGO conventions, and proudly maintains a fine Flemish harpsichord meticulously refurbished by Norman Purdy.
