SYDNEY HOEHL is a 3rd-year trumpet performance major at the University of Oregon where she plays in the symphony orchestra, wind ensemble, and jazz band. She is originally from Litchfield, Illinois. SHERI PYRON learned to play horn in the Pleasant Hill School District and performed regularly while studying architecture at the University of Oregon. She returned to the horn 7 years ago after careers in architecture and jewelry-making. She has two amazing children, Madeleine who is currently studying at Cambridge, and Nathan who is a company member with the Orlando Ballet.

SHIRA FADELEY teaches band and choir at Roosevelt Middle School where she learned to play trombone as a student. She has taught music in the Eugene schools after leaving the Salem-Keizer School district, where she taught for 16 years. She has performed with the Eugene Symphony, Eugene Opera, Cascade Slides, and Festival Chorale Oregon. Her first trombone was named Clarence, and now, fittingly, she plays a Shires.

CARI EARNHARDT is a freelance musician based in both Eugene, OR and Tucson, AZ. She spends her musical time playing in brass quintets, symphony orchestras, and arranging her most beloved jazz tunes for tuba. In her free time she enjoys rock climbing and exploring nature with friends.

At the University of Oregon School of Music and Dance she is Instructor of Trumpet and a member of the Oregon Brass Quintet. Sarah is originally from Tacoma, Washington and is a humble servant to her cats Hops and Scotch.

MELODY JOY JACKSON grew up in the area. She lived on the Oregon coast for 15 years before returning to the Willamette Valley. Melody is a multi-instrumentalist, music teacher and audio engineer. She has never seen a sasquatch but hopes to one day.

DONOR SPOTLIGHT

ADITH MOURSUND can always be found sitting in one of the pews close to the front of the sanctuary on Sunday mornings. She makes sure that she is there in time to hear the prelude on the organ.



Adith and her siblings, Elaine and Larry, loved growing up in Boulder, Colorado where her father was an elementary school teacher. In 1944, her family moved to Eugene. Her father became Director of Special Education with the 4J School District and held that position until he retired. They lived on Moss Street and, as luck would have it, a young man named Robert Moursund lived right across the street. Adith and Robert became friends, fell in love, and were married. Robert worked for Eugene 4J Schools as a vice-principal at Sheldon from 1965 to 1980, and at Churchill from 1980 to 1991. Robert died of a heart-attack in 1992.

Music has always been a big part of Adith's life. During her younger years, she played the piano, violin, viola, and enjoyed the percussion section in the marching band. Adith played in the Eugene Junior Symphony. She also played in the marching band in high school and at the University of Oregon. As she watches the UO

Marching Band today, Adith admires their classy uniforms and, humorously, recalls the attire during her time in the band: any pants and shirts that were green and/or yellow.

Adith grew up in the Methodist Church and joined First United Methodist when her family moved to Eugene in 1944. The church choir was started in the old building on Willamette in 1948 and Adith sang in the choir for more than 40 years.

Over the years, she has been an active member of this congregation as a musician and a caring member of the United Women's Fellowship. Concerts at First is forever grateful to Adith for her generous financial gifts to the organ fund and Concerts at First.
