5. The instructor was readily available (e.g., email, office hours, or one-on-one consultation).



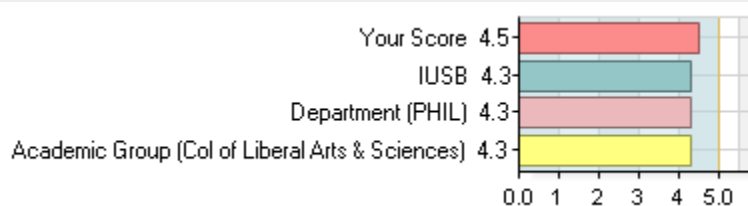

-I don't know since I never tried to contact him outside of class.

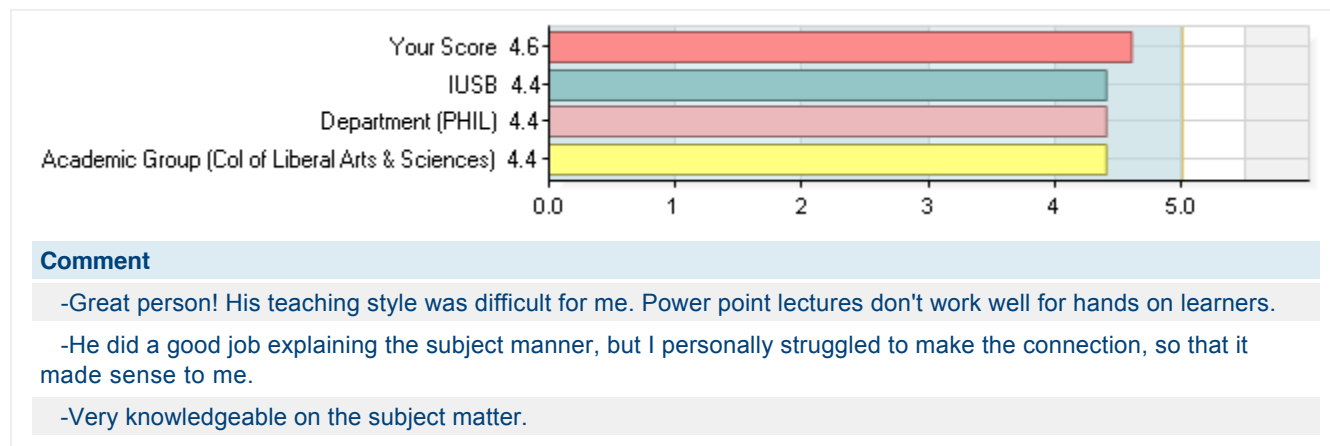
