MEEKS FAMILY HISTORY

Our fore parents settled in Canton, Mississippi many, many years ago. Canton is situated about eighteen miles north of Jackson, the Capitol of Mississippi.

After settling in Canton, our grandfather, Abner Meeks, Sr., was born on September 8, 1879, to the proud parents of Eddie and Betty Hampton Meeks.

Papa's grandmother on his father's side was an African, named Becky. His grandmother on his mother's side was named Delphia, having white straight hair that was soft as feathers. He never heard her say a harsh word to anybody.

Papa's father affectionately called "Grandpa Eddie" was a church going man. In his church, he was a class leader and a steward (same as a deacon). He liked dressing up and he loved to go places. He was not a field man. Papa said, "Grandpa Eddie raised him, and he hit him only two times in his life." Papa also said, "Grandpa Eddie was the ONLY person to ever hit him."

Papa's mother was named Betty. She was a fair skinned woman and wore her hair cut short in the back with bangs. She went to church almost every Sunday. Although her membership was at Bethel Church, Papa recalled his mother and father riding side saddle to Sweet Water Church.

At the age of seventeen (17), Papa Abner married the former Madora Haymore (Mama Dora). She was the proud daughter of the late Reverend Tee and Cordelia Henderson Haymore. Mama Dora's father, Tee Haymore was a Methodist Minister, after their marriage, Papa Abner and Mama Dora moved to Holmes County (Acona Community) in Lexington, Mississippi.

To this union fourteen (14) children were born. Two died in infancy. Although, they were now parents of the remaining twelve (12) children, they also found in their hearts the love and endurance to raise a grandson, Willie "Joe" Meeks. Thus, they raised thirteen (13) children.

Papa Abner and Mama Dora will always be remembered as the sweetest parents and grandparents in the world. Their love, kindness and guidance influenced their children to the extent that all of them remembered their home atmosphere as a place filled with love for each other, and the willingness to help each other.


After a long illness, Mama Dora departed this life on August 22, 1948, at the age of 56. Papa Abner had a healthy and fulfilling life and on July 10, 1987, God called him home too. He was 107 years old.

We are celebrating on the land owned by Papa Abner. The land where he raised his family. Papa Abner acquired the land from his sister, Ruth who was known as Aunt Pete. Aunt Pete was married to Joe Love and after his death, the land went to Aunt Pete and before her death, she Will the land to Papa Abner. Papa stated that it was enough land for each of his children to have a equal portion.

Despite our grandparents, and some of our parents' deaths, "THE MEEKS FAMILY" has maintained closeness in love, and we continue to grow and have concern for each other. Papa was always a kind, proud independent father, a grandfather, great-great-great-great grandfather. We are witnessing seven generations in the Meeks Family. God is Good.



Abner "Papa" Meeks, Sr. born September 8, 1879, in Madison County, MS. Moved to Holmes County, MS at a young age and united with Bethel CME church. He married Madora Haymore, and 14 children were born to this union, 2 died at birth. Papa Abner died on July 10, 1987, at the age of 107.

Madora Haymore-Meeks was born March 10, 1892, in Madison County, MS and later moved to Holmes County, MS after marrying Abner Meeks. She united with Bethel CME Church and died August 22, 1948, at the age of 56.



CONNIE MEEKS-ELLIS 1904-2006



Connie was born on December 25,1904, in the Acona Community, she was the oldest of the siblings. She joined Bethel CME Church and later joined Long Branch MB Church. She often remembered growing up with her brothers and sisters and how she had to care for the younger one. She had to wash clothes, clean the house, pick cotton, milk the cows, prepare breakfast, dinner, and supper. Connie married David Ellis on December 20, 1931, and to this union 8 children were born. Her legacy includes grandchildren, great grandchildren, great-great grandchildren and even great-great-great children. She departed this life on March 19, 2006, at the age of 102. Her advice was" Live a good life, have faith in God and success will come your way."

JOSHUA MEEKS 1908-1981



Joshua was born August 28, 1908. The oldest of the brothers, marrying Eula Lee on December 25, 1929, and they were married for over 53 years, and they lived in Lexington, MS, where they raised 5 boys and 2 girls. His legacy includes 37 grandchildren, 89 great grandchildren, 83 great-great grandchildren, and 7 great-great grandchildren. His advice was "get a religion, live a Christian life and get an education." Joshua departed this life on February 24, 1981, at the age of 73.

LUCILLE MEEKS-RAND 1910-2000



Lucille, known as Scooter, was born February 15, 1910. She became a Christian early in life and united with Bethel CME. In 1927, she was united in holy matrimony to John Henry Rand and united with New Zion MB Church. To this union ten children were born. Her legacy includes 41 grandchildren, 83 great grandchildren, 59 great-great grandchildren, and 1 great-great-great grandchild. Her advice was, "Let God be at the head of your life and He will bless and keep you." Scooter passed this life on February 28, 2000, 13 days after her 90th birthday.

CORIMA MEEKS-MEEKIE 1911-1997



CORIMA (Cora) known as Bucheem was born February 22, 1911, in Lexington, MS and died July 4, 1997. On December 5, 1930, she joined in Holy Matrimony with Roy Meekie and 10 children were born. In the 1960's, she moved to St. Louis, MO and united with Compton Hill MB Church. She always had a smile on her face and was always quiet and never raised her voice. Her advice was: "Have a strong belief in God." Her legacy includes 10 children, 45 grandchildren, 132 great grandchildren, 181- 6th generation of great-great grandchildren, and her 7th generation includes 18 great-great-great grandchildren.

JOHN EDGAR "Alex" MEEKS 1914-1998



John Edgar was known as Alex. Alex was born December 5, 1914, and departed this life on July 11, 1998. He confessed a hope in Christ and joined Bethel CME Church and attend school in Holmes County, MS. He married Ruby Lee Flowers, and 6 children were born to this union. He later married Pearlie Keys and had 10 children. He enjoyed his childhood with his brothers and sisters. Alex's advice was, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." Alex legacy includes 16 children. 62 grandchildren, 90 great grandchildren, 93 great-great grandchildren, and 6 great-great-great grandchildren.

BERTHA ANN MEEKS-ERVIN 1916-1987



Bertha Ann was known as Nigga. She was born on September 26, 1916, and departed this life on September 22, 1987, she married Otha Lee Ervin and fellowshipped with Bethel CME Church. Her legacy includes 10 children who were born into this union. 24 grandchildren, 31 great grands, 17 great-great grands. Her advice: "Get all the education you can. Keep God in your life and let him lead you the right way."

Lula was born July 3, 1917, and passed this life on February 21, 1994. In 1934, at the age of 17, she married S. C. Williams, and 12 children were born to this union. Lula rose at 5 am to make homemade biscuits for her family after growing up in a home with her siblings, where she lived a life rich in love, family, and faith. She confessed Christ and joined Bethel CME Church and later united with Union AME. Lula later joined Sweet Canaan COGIC where she took pride in her faith and loved cooking for her family and community. She shared a special bond with her father, often preparing meals for him. Her advice: "Take one day at a time and do not worry." She departed this life on December 23, 1991. Her legacy includes 9 children, 23 grandchildren, 42 great grandchildren, 21 great- great grandchildren.

NORA ANN MEEKS-TRAVIS 1922-2012



Nora Ann was born January 27, 1922, and passed this life in March of 2012. She married William Travis on April 20, 1941, and to this union 9 children were born. Her legacy produced 33 grandchildren, 66 great grandchildren, 61 great-great grands, and 1 great-great grandchild. Memory lane: She remembered the 12-to-14-mile walks to church, playing hide and seek with her sisters and friends, and walking home from school, picking grapes and huckleberries. His advice was: "Go to school and get a good education." His legacy consists of 4 children, 13 grandchildren, and 9 great grandchildren.

CHARLIE MEEKS 1930-1995



Charlie known as Shed, was born June 6, 1930, and passed this life on August 3, 1995. He attended Shiloh Public School in Lexington, MS and was a member of Bethel CME Church, then Strangers Home Baptist Church in Greenwood, MS before moving to St. Louis, MO. He married Ruthelle Polk. Shed had one daughter and one son, and his legacy includes 6 grandchildren and 6 great grands. Shed biggest memory while growing up at home was that there was a real togetherness that existed among the children. They never tried to hurt one another. His advice: "Live right and do right. Don't try to beat people but try to help people."

MANERVIA MEEKS-CALHOUN 1933-2016



Manervia known as "Coonbaby" was born May 6, 1933. Coonbaby left Mississippi, after the passing of her mother to live with her brother, Jack and his wife, Annie Mae. In 1954, she married Guy Lee Calhoun and moved to New Orleans, Louisiana. She united with St. Thomas Missionary Baptist Church. Coonbaby, departed this life on October 8, 2016. Her advice: "Keep Christ in your life and keep your hands in God's hand." Her legacy includes 9 children, 16 grandchildren, and 39 great grandchildren.

WILLIE JOE MEEKS 1927-2005



Willie was born December 23, 1927, in Lexington. He was the oldest child of Connie Meeks-Ellis. Joe as he was called, was raised by his grandparents, Papa Abner and Mama Dora. People thought he was actually Papa Abner and Mama Dora's son. They never made a difference between him and their birth children. That's how much love they showed to all their children. Joe married Gracie Byrd on January 23, 1954, and to this union 12 children were born. 3 died as infants. Joe was never afraid of hard work. He bought a home to raise and take care of his family with only a 2nd grade education. He was a stern and soft-spoken man who loved his family. Joe departed this life March 28, 2005. He will always be remembered for his soft smile and gentle nature and his favorite saying, "Hot Dog." His legacy includes 6 children, 24 grandchildren, and 6 great-grandchildren.


