





EDUCATION CORNER WHAT HAPPENS AFTER AN ORGAN DONOR REFERRAL IS MADE

Once a donation referral has been made, the evaluation process by CDT begins. Here's what to expect:



Organ Donation Referral made by RN

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• RN calls 1-800-803-6667, presses 2 for "vented with a heart beat"

The Donor Resource Center (DRC) staff takes initial information from the RNpt name, DOB, MRN, etc. DRC staff check state donor registries. A CDT referral number is provided to the RN.

The DRC pushes referral information to the CDT Team for immediate review

A CDT Donation Coordinator will call back to the bedside for an initial assessment of the potential for organ donation. Common questions asked by CDT will include:

- Admission course / notable medical history
- Neurological function- brain stem reflexes
- Care plan, code status, timeline for end-of-life if known
- Family- decision maker(s), plan, understanding of prognosis

CDT will call to the bedside at 8am & 8pm each day for updates. If CDT has remote access to the hospital EMR, CDT will access the chart remotely for ongoing review. If a patient is not a candidate for organ donation, the RN will only be required to report time of death (TOD) when such occurs.

If there is potential for organ donation, CDT will meet with a patient's family when readiness triggers for a discussion are met. These can include:

Family Mentions Donation	They want to donate or expresses an interest in talking about it				
Brain Death Pronounced: Family Verbalizes Understanding	Patient has been pronounced brain dead. Family has been given this information, and express an understanding their loved one has died.				
Decision to Limit, Decelerate or WD Therapies	Team maintains therapies until there has been a donation discussion. Withdrawal or deceleration should not occur until there is a donation decision.				
Family Understands There Is No Hope For Recovery	This may occur <i>prior</i> to brain death pronouncement or during family care plan meetings				
Pulmonary or Hemodynamic Instability (On the Verge of Coding)	This could impact the patient/family donation opportunity. Team should fully support until there is a donation discussion.				
Team Mentions Donation	The donation discussion should be a coordinated effort, led by CDT in collaboration with the Team. Refrain from discussing donation without CDT involvement
