

General Rules

1. Age Divisions:

Helotes Youth Soccer Association adopts U.S. Soccer and USYS-recognized age groupings for all league play:

U5	4 years old	3v3	6 players

Note: Players must meet the age requirement as of January 1 of the current seasonal year.

3. League Schedule:

- a. Fall Season: Begins approximately September through December
- b. Spring Season: Begins approximately February through April

4. Team Registration:

All teams must register with HYSA. Applications and fees are due prior to each seasonal start date.

5. Player Eligibility:

Players must submit valid age documentation (birth certificate or passport) upon first-time registration.

6. Roster Limits:

As listed above in the age division table.

7. Transfers/Releases:

Allowed only under conditions such as injury, relocation, or disciplinary violations. Transfers must be approved in writing by the HYSA registrar.

8. Tryouts:

Tryouts for the upcoming seasonal year may begin in May.

Rules of Play

1. Match Governance:

- a. FIFA Laws of the Game apply, modified by HYSA rules for youth play.
- b. Teams are responsible for the behavior of their players, coaches, and spectators.

2. Player Documentation:

- a. All players must have a valid HYSA player pass with photo and unique ID.
- b. Only official printed rosters from the HYSA system are allowed—no handwritten names.

3. Referee Assignment:

- a. One center referee will be assigned for all matches up to 9v9.
- b. All referees must be USSF-certified.

4. Uniforms and Equipment:

- a. Numbered jerseys are mandatory.
- b. The first team listed wears a darker jersey; the second team wears lighter.
- c. In case of a color conflict, the home team must change.

- d. Shin guards are mandatory.
- e. The referee's decision on uniform issues is final.

5. **Game Format & Duration**:

Water breaks and heat-related adjustments may be implemented at the referee's discretion.

7. Substitutions:

Unlimited; permitted at referee discretion during stoppages.

8. Scoring & Standings:

o Win: 3 points

o Tie: 1 point

Loss: 0 points

9. Tiebreakers (in order):

- Head-to-head (if only 2 teams)
- Goal difference (max 4 per game)
- Goals scored (max 4 per game)
- Least goals allowed
- Coin toss or playoff

10. Forfeits:

- a. Recorded as 4-0.
- b. Repeated no-shows or ineligible players may lead to standings penalties or fines.
- c. Four forfeits may result in expulsion from the league.

11. Match Abandonment:

Teams not showing up or walking off the field without justification are considered to have abandoned the match.

• After halftime, score will stand unless HYSA rules otherwise.

Code of Conduct & Discipline

1. Sideline Behavior:

- a. Teams on one side of the field; spectators on the opposite.
- b. Coaches and spectators must remain in their designated areas.
- c. Coaches must display KidSafe/SafeSport credentials at all times.

2. Discipline:

- a. Red cards and ejections will be logged. Four in one season may result in team suspension.
- b. Red-carded players may stay on the bench (wearing a pinnie or alternate jersey), unless asked to leave by the referee.
- c. Ejected coaches or spectators must leave the field area (out of sight and sound).
- d. Violent conduct or mass altercations may lead to full team dismissal from the competition and additional review by HYSA.

Protests & Appeals

1. Protest Validity Requirements:

- a. Must be written on the Game Card and submitted to the onsite HYSA Director.
- b. Must be filed with the HYSA Appeals Chair within 12 hours of the match.
- c. Must include all written details of the incident.
- d. A \$250 protest fee is required (cash, cashier's check, or money order payable to HYSA).

2. Protest Process:

- a. The Appeals Committee will notify all involved parties.
- b. Each team may have up to 2 witnesses.
- c. Referee judgment calls are not eligible for protest.
- d. Appeals Committee decisions are final and binding.
