Updates and Tips

SYSTEM UPGRADES

Your PUD is working hard on a wide range of upgrades including replacing systems controls and filtration at our main water treatment plant.

We are actively working with state leadership to secure funds to help with these system improvements.

CONSERVATION TIP OF THE MONTH

Concerned about a high water bill? Approximately 27% of domestic water usage comes from toilet flushing. A leaky toilet can have a major impact on your bill. However, a leaky toilet is harder to detect than a leaky faucet because it can be silent. You may not hear or notice it running.

Here is a simple at home test you can use to see if your toilet is leaking:

- Drip 10 to 15 drops of food coloring into the toilet tank. DO NOT FLUSH
- Wait 10 minutes
- If colored water appears in the toilet bowl, you have a leak.

A faulty flapper or plunger ball causes most toilet leaks. Remember to check them regularly and replace when necessary.
