In his role as Executive Director of the Georgia

Cyber Center, Mr. Toler is responsible for fulfilling the mission of the Georgia Cyber Center, which is to create an ecosystem of collaboration that helps solve our state's and our nation's most challenging cybersecurity problems through innovative education, training, research, and practical applications

between private and public industries. He works with a multitude of partners from government, academia, and private industry to help develop the professional workforce required to secure our state and our nation in cyberspace. In addition to numerous military schools and training, Mr. Toler holds a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry from Henderson State University, a Master of Public Administration from the University of Kansas, and a Master of Science in National Security Strategy from National Defense University. He has numerous military awards and decorations, to include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, and two Bronze Star Medals. Join us in welcoming Eric to Augusta.

The building was purchased on November 19th, 2018, renovations to the building will occur November 2018-February 2019, renovations to the Playground will occur January-March of 2019 and the Opening for the Augusta School of Integrated Learning will be on

August of 2019. Dr. Jennifer Jones is the Executive Director and Founder. MONETARY DONATIONS FOR THE VALLEY OF ALBANY: The Valley of Albany, Orient of Georgia has sustained major damage to their facility. In the past two years, Albany has thrice been hit with devastation: First, a tornado ripped through the city in January 2017 while on a 70 mile path that left parts of the city smashed and five people dead. Then, eight months later, Hurricane Irma scarred the region's crops after it meandered up from the Florida Gulf Coast. And October 2018 Hurricane Michael tore through the Gulf Coast as a massive Category 4 storm and reached Georgia still a Category 3 storm and was still packing Category 2 winds as it reached Albany. The Valley of Albany Scottish Rite Facility was severely damaged, estimates range in the neighborhood of \$30,000 to \$40,000.00. The Insurance which covers each valley has a clause the reads that for major storms there is a \$50,000.00 deductible. Our Sovereign Grand Inspector General, Illustrious Brother Ted Collins is asking each of the remaining 5 valleys in Georgia to help if they can.
