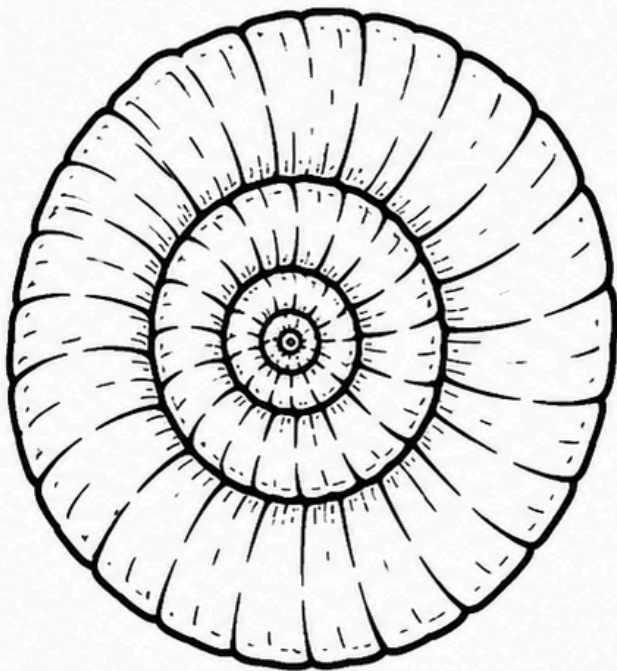

HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

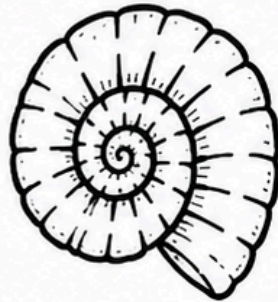
- ① Look for fossils in the gorge.

 - Do a rubbing in the box.

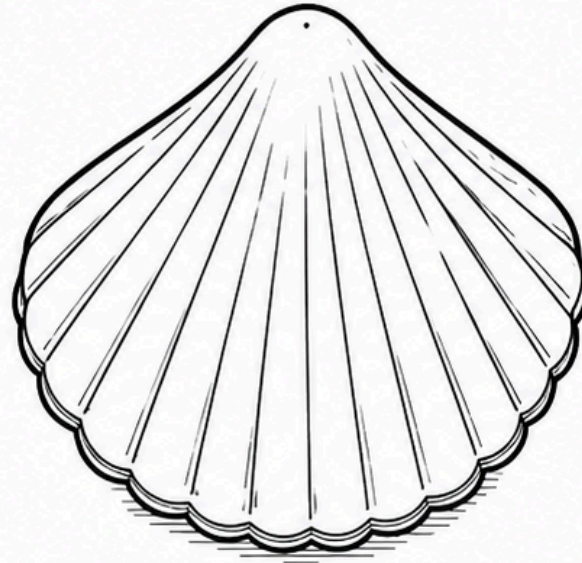


- ③ Try to find as many as you can!



TIP: Place paper over fossil and rub with side of crayon!

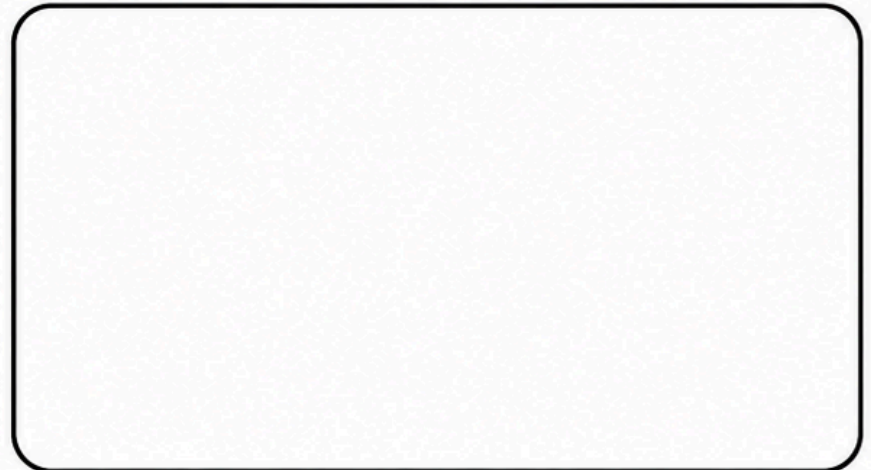
BRACHIOPOD



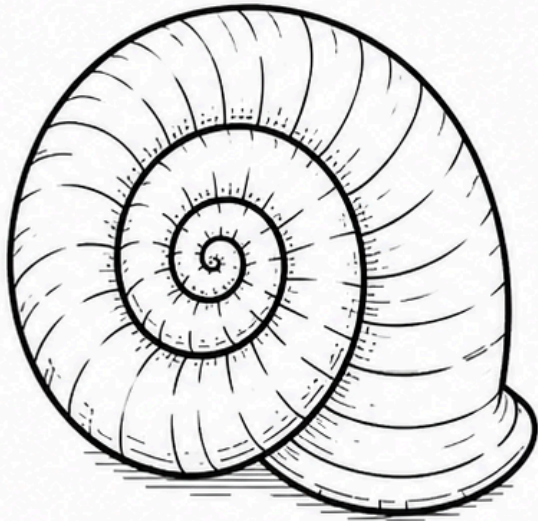
A brachiopod looks like a shell, but it's actually a sea animal that lived over 350 million years ago!

Looks like a clam, but it's not!

RUBBING BOX



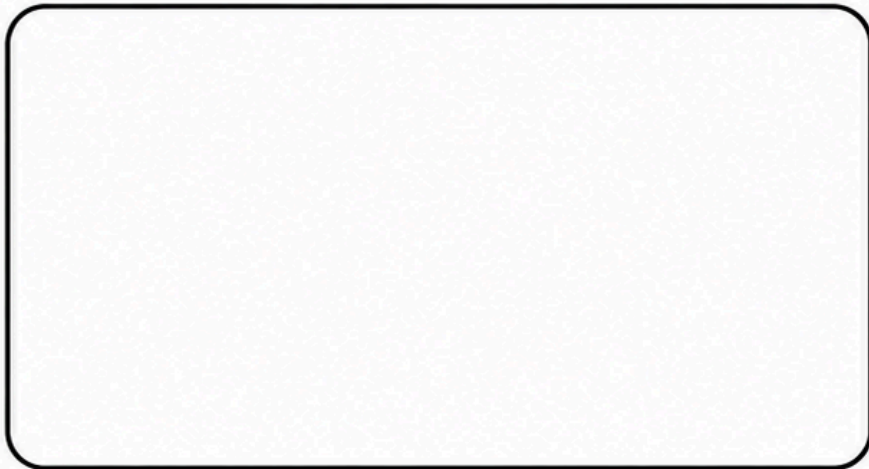
GASTROPOD (SNAIL)



This fossil is from an ancient sea snail!

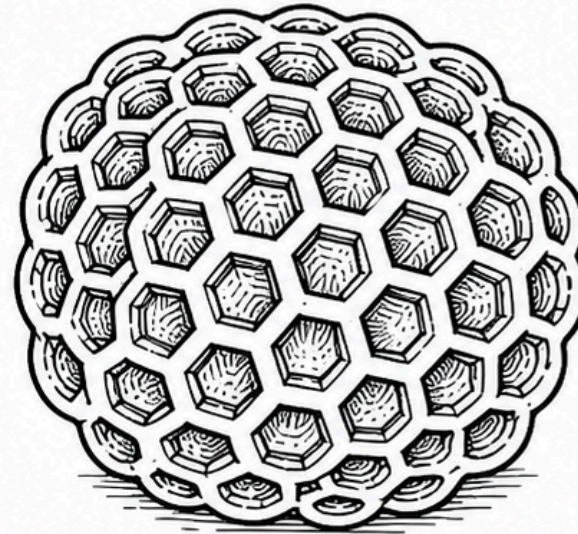
Look for spiral shapes!

These fossils are from ancient coral reefs—like an underwater city!

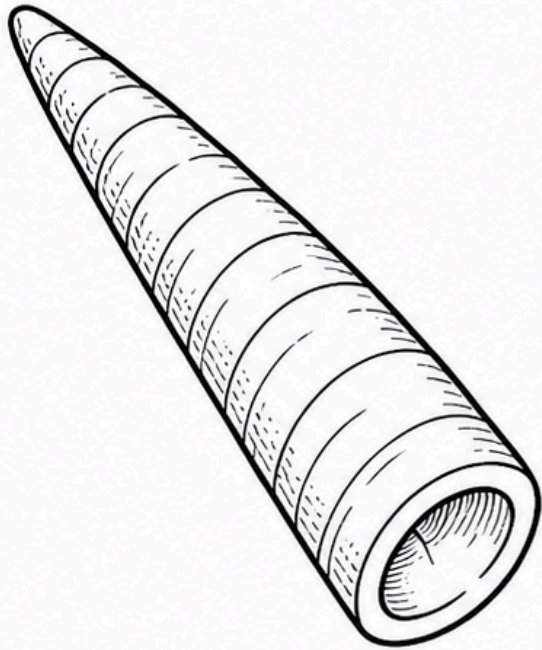
Look for patterns like honeycombs or tiny tubes!

A long, straight-shelled ocean animal related to squids and octopuses.

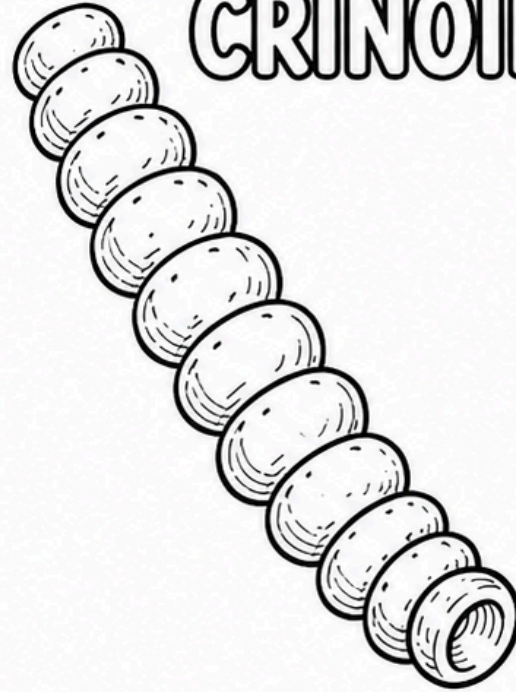
Look for long, straight cone shapes!

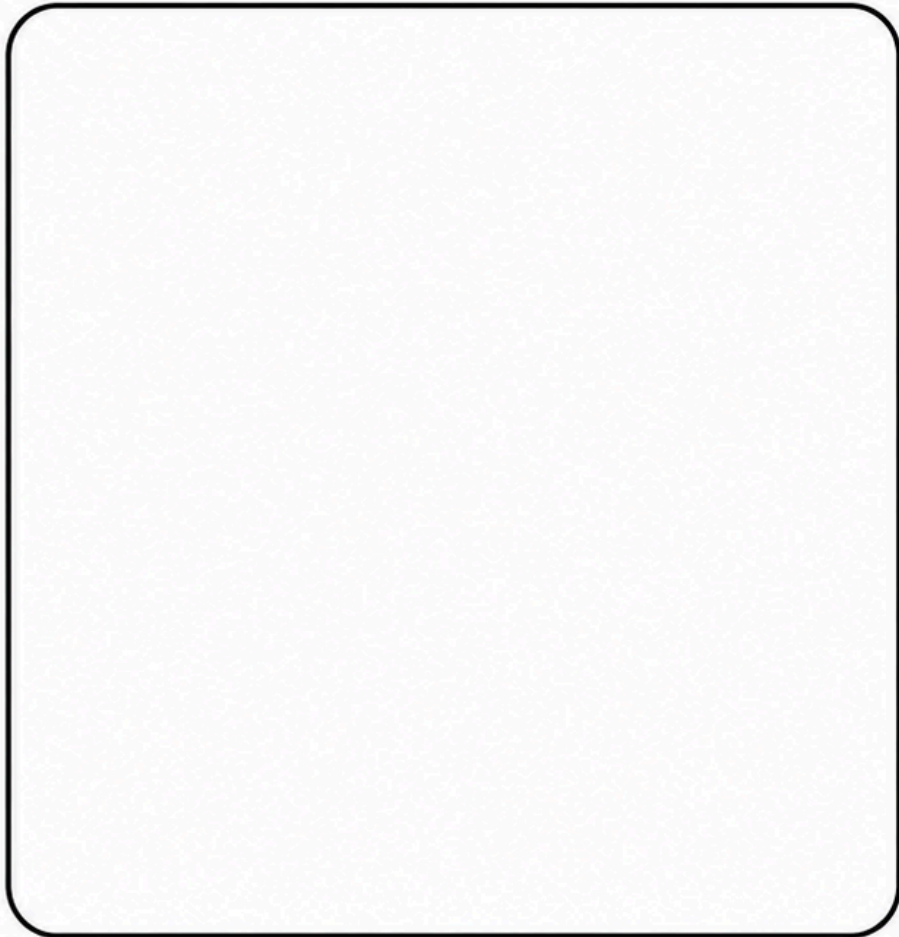

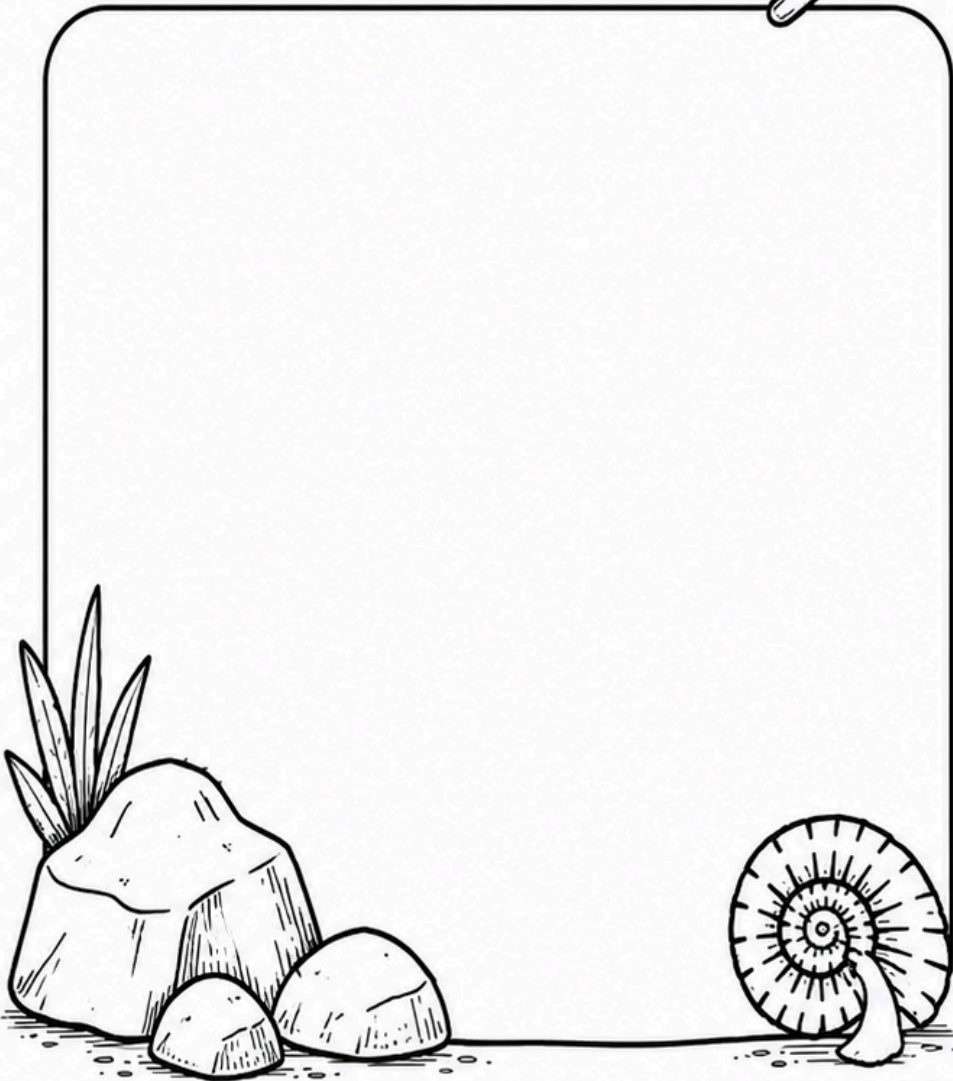

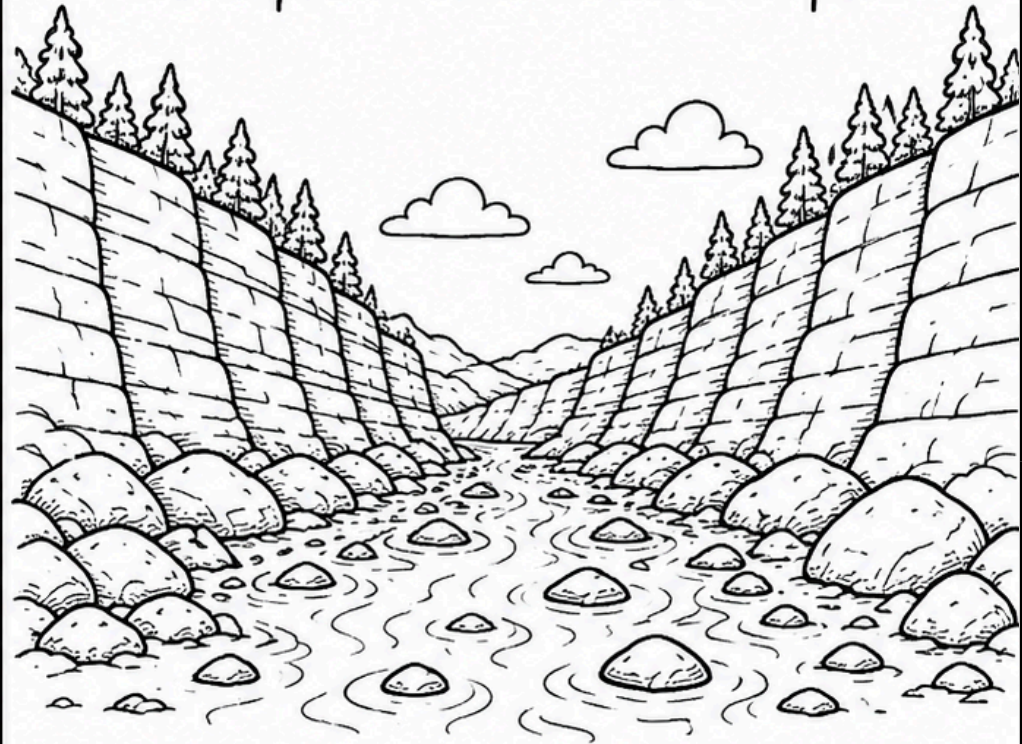
