Cookies may be "session cookies," which expire when you close your browser, or "persistent cookies," which remain on your device until they expire or are deleted.

3. Types of Cookies We Use

We use the following categories of cookies:

- **Strictly Necessary Cookies** – Required for the operation of our platform, security features, and system integrity.
- **Performance and Analytics Cookies** – Help us understand platform usage, system performance, and improve functionality.
- **Functionality Cookies** – Remember your preferences such as language, region, or settings.
- **Targeting and Advertising Cookies** – Used (where applicable) to deliver relevant content or measure campaign effectiveness.
- **Device and Telemetry Cookies** – Used by SeaGuardian systems for diagnostics, telemetry, sensor tracking, and device health monitoring.

4. Why We Use Cookies

SeaGuardian uses cookies for several important purposes:

- Ensuring the security and stability of our platforms and connected devices.
- Enhancing navigation, login sessions, and user experience.
- Monitoring system behaviour and detecting anomalies or misuse.
- Providing analytics that help improve SeaGuardian's maritime tracking, monitoring, and alerting services.

- Delivering relevant operational messages, updates, or optional marketing communications.

5. Third-Party Cookies

Some cookies may be placed by trusted third-party partners, including:

- Analytics providers (e.g., telemetry analytics services).
- Security and fraud-prevention partners.
- Hosting or cloud infrastructure providers supporting SeaGuardian's operations.

These third parties may use cookies to collect information about your online activity or device interactions. They are required to maintain adequate data protection and security measures.

6. Data Collected Through Cookies

Depending on the cookie type, we may collect information such as:

- Device identifiers and metadata.
- Location or GPS-related data (if enabled).
- Browser type and version.
- System performance metrics.
- User interaction behaviour within the platform.
- Telemetry or sensor-generated data (specific to SeaGuardian systems).
