SUMMER FUELLED UP BAND CAMP

In our last newsletter we had just delivered our Easter Fuelled Up sessions which were a great success. This last week saw us deliver another week of activities in conjunction with North Lincolnshire Council. We hosted sessions for youngsters aged between 7-16 years old, providing a mixture of activities including: creating their own pieces of music, playing solo's and ensembles, learning new instruments, arts, dance, singing, creating their own radio advert and lots of games. We enjoyed another delicious lunch courtesy of Margarets sandwich shop in Barton (Burnett's General Store). We learnt about different foods and even did some taste testing with a mixture of thumbs up and thumbs down!! The sessions have now affectionately become known as 'Band Camp' by our regular attendees.

We were delighted that our own MD Garry was able to deliver a quality music session to our children, introducing them to the different instruments in a brass band. Showing them how to get notes out of the instruments, the importance of embouchure when playing and got them all performing as an ensemble with a couple of pieces of music. There was a lot of natural talent in the room as well as a lot of giggles trying to get a note out of some of the instruments.

Liz Drury of Liz Drury Voiceovers was with us once more to give the children the benefit of her expertise when it comes to creating a radio advert. Liz is a freelance VoiceOver artist with over 10 years experience, local, national and international! Thinking about healthy food and life-style, the children had to create their own healthy snack bar, so we looked at all the different fruits (and vegetables) that there are, discussed flavour combinations and what someone would buy in a shop. They then came up with their own scripts to advertise their creation and a picture of what it would look like. Liz then helped the children record their scripts, then with some editing magic added backing music to make their adverts sound super professional. The children were amazed when they heard their adverts back. Thanks again Liz for giving your time up to provide this experience for the children.

As you will see from some of the pictures attached, we had lots of fun once more. Thanks to all who were involved with these activities.
