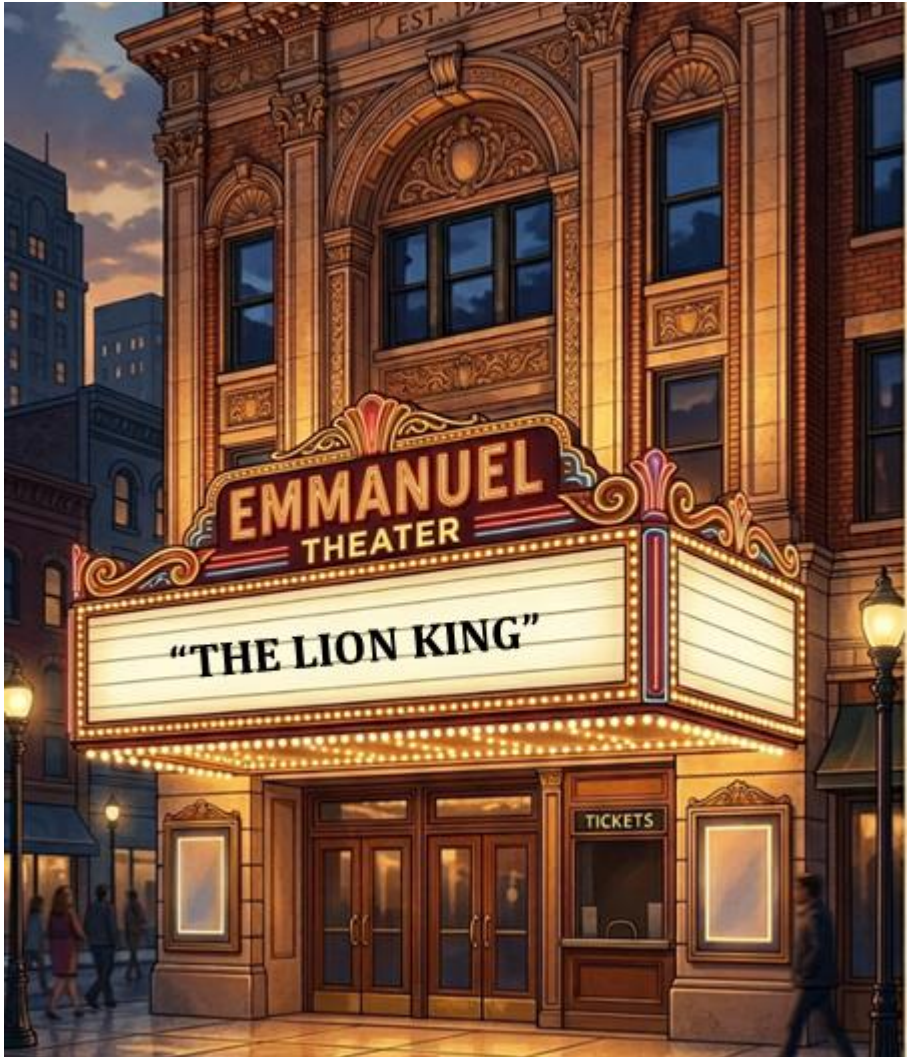

FOR FURTHER REFLECTION

The movie 'The Lion King' raises several questions that can help us on our spiritual journey. Take some time this week and reflect on the following:

- When Simba is lost in the wilderness, Mufasa's spirit appears and says, "Remember who you are. You are my son." How does knowing you are a child of the Heavenly King change the way you view your worth, especially when you feel lost or isolated?
- Simba allowed Scar's lies to dictate his identity for years, causing him to hide in the jungle. What "lies of the enemy" or past mistakes have you allowed to define you? How can you tune out those voices to hear God instead?
- Rafiki famously tells Simba, "The past can hurt. But the way I see it, you can either run from it or learn from it." In what areas of your life are you running from past guilt or shame instead of bringing it to God for healing?
- Timon and Pumbaa's philosophy means "no worries," but for Simba, it was also a way to avoid responsibility and conviction. Is there a "Hakuna Matata" mindset in your life where you are using worldly distractions to avoid what God is calling you to face?
- Mufasa explains that a true king looks at what he can give to the kingdom, while Scar only cares about what he can take. How does Mufasa's view of leadership align with Jesus' teachings on servant leadership? How can you practice this in your family, workplace, or church?
- When Simba returns to the Pride Lands, he brings life back to a dead wasteland. How does the restoration of the Pride Lands reflect the biblical promise that God will eventually renew and restore all of creation?
