Dr. Chan Hellman is a professor at the Anne & Henry Zarrow School of Social Work and also the director of the Hope Research Center at the University of Oklahoma. He earned his bachelor's degree from Northwestern Oklahoma State University, his master's degree from the University of Central Oklahoma, and his Ph.D. from Oklahoma State University. Dr. Hellman has been a faculty member for more than 20 years. His research grants accumulate over \$2.2 million. He has authored a book, and 71 peer-reviewed papers, chaired 17 thesis and dissertations and given over 120 conference presentations. His research interests include how hope can help overcome trauma among individuals served by nonprofit organizations.



HOW TO USE YOUR PARKING CODE

(FOR PRE-REGISTERED GUESTS)
