While in college, Thurman was recognized for his athletic prowess. At Cornell he was a member of three unbeaten teams - football, basketball and track. He played on two "Big Red" Championship teams as right end and place kicker.

Boddie later became a noted sports official, including serving as an umpire in the International League. He became the President and area representative for the District Umpires Association. He also became President of the Syracuse Intercollegiate Football Officials.
