While on the JV football team he scored 5 touchdowns in one game. In track he broke the record for the 180 yard low hurdles and was a member of the 880 record breaking relay team. Austin was All-County and Co-Captain of the track team. He was also All-County in football, going both ways, and scoring 4 touchdowns in a game against Mt. St. Michaels. Arnie was also a recipient of the Con Edison Award. Crowning his athletic achievements, Arnie was named "Best Athlete" at NRHS for the 59-60 Year.
