The "Elderly and Disabled Refund Payment" provides a partial refund of property taxes, (or the equivalent in rent), is available for older adults (age 65 or older), who are financially stressed or are living with disabilities. To qualify as an older adult with disabilities, the applicant must either have received SSI, SSDI, or Veterans Benefits for the entire year for which taxes are filed. The applicants must qualify based on residence and the maximum amount an applicant can receive is based on income.


