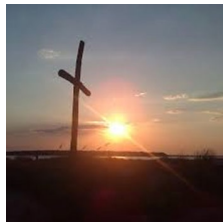

FROM THE BISHOP'S CLERGY REPRESENTATIVE

Cursillistas of the Anglican Diocese of South Carolina:

Cursillo is now once again in full swing in our diocese with yet another powerful weekend coming up October 13-16. As in the past, this weekend will be held at Camp St. Christopher, and I fully expect God to meet the team and pilgrims there in a powerful way, just as He faithfully has for 190 Cursillo Weekends in our diocese. What a blessing it is for the Cursillo Community and new participants to stand on the shoulders of those who have gone before us!

As the Body of Christ moves forward toward the culmination of history, God remains unchanged. He is our continuous anchor in all of the storms of life. And, while He does not change, we do! That goes for our Cursillo movement also. Human nature compels us to long for the "good old days", when we had five Cursillo Weekends a year, all filled to overflowing with large teams and large groups of participants. And I often find myself thinking of how I long for us to return to those days. But to think in that way robs us of what God is doing in the present. While we are now having two weekends and one retreat each year, and while the numbers are smaller than they were in what we often think of as "the glory days of Cursillo," God is STILL moving in powerful ways to bring new light, new mission, and spiritual energy to those who experience Cursillo Weekends AND to the Fourth Day Community! While our movement may be smaller, it is absolutely no less powerful than it has been in the years since Cursillo began in our diocese in the late 1970's. God is faithful, and God has consistently used Cursillo as a powerful tool in His hand in this diocese. And, I have all faith that He will continue to bless Cursillo in proportion to our faith and care of the movement.

Now, more than ever, we need the clarity of our spiritual life that a Cursillo Weekend brings to those participating. We need, more than ever, that sparkplug of spiritual energy that makes its way from Camp St. Christopher on Sunday afternoon back into the local parishes. And we need, more than ever, the trans-parish relationships that are built across our diocese by members of the Cursillo Community in all of our churches. There is NO downside to Cursillo. There is nothing but good that comes for the individual participants and team members and for the parishes to which they return.

All of that said, there is no down-side to sponsorship and nurturing Cursillo in each of our parishes. I urge you, by the mercies of God, to remember the powerful effect Cursillo had on YOU, and be willing to share that experience with others by sponsoring new pilgrims and by taking an active part in the movement. Cherish and build up Cursillo in your local parish. If your parish is not active in Cursillo, be the catalyst for bringing Cursillo to your people. I am thrilled to say that we have a full Cursillo for October, necessitating closing registration weeks before the Weekend. Thanks be to God!! And thanks to all who have been praying, talking to their clergy, and sponsoring people to come to Cursillo. That's answered prayer! Let's not stop there, keep it up!!! People have been shut in way too long; they need Christian community. What better way to get them moving on a personal, lifelong journey with their Lord and Savior than to attend a Cursillo Weekend!!

Our rector, Stephen Arscott, and Team #191 have been praying and working hard to be ready for those who have been called to come to this weekend as participants. As you know, your prayers are the BEST Palanca! I ask that you continue praying for the team and the participants! It is my prayer that our Lord and Savior will continue to be Glorified through this amazing ministry, and may His Spirit continue to move in and through every participant and every team member on this weekend and for our weekends to come!

Due to the fire in the dining hall last December, we are still using Susanna's House as the dining hall for the camp. However, **we will** be using it for the Clausura/closing. The Clausura for #190 was held in the Chapel of the Palms, but it's not large enough to really accommodate the team, participants, sponsors, and all of those coming to welcome our newest Cursillistas into their 4th Day!!

With the loss of the dining hall, it was decided through much prayer, discussion with the Secretariat, and a wake-up committee that we would do a trial **"team only"** Wake-up for Cursillo #190. It was a huge success! Thank you, Lord! Thank you, Team!! The table facilitators found out over the weekend what everyone liked to drink first thing in the morning. So that is what was delivered to them by the team along with some mini muffins. The rest of the team stood out in front singing to them as their goodies were being delivered. Most of the participants stepped to the door or out in front of their rooms to listen to the singing, and some joined in. As Sunday is one of the most important days of the weekend preparing participants for their 4th Day through the Group Reunion and Ultreya rollos, their wake-up did not take place until 7:00 AM, providing them and the team extra needed sleep. Since this new process was so well received and extended sleep, we will continue to do this at least until a new dining hall can be built. **I'm asking that you continue to help to spread the word that we are not doing a Cursillo wide wake-up at this time. It will continue to be a "team only" wake-up.** Sponsors will need to be at the Clausura/closing to welcome them into their 4th Day.

I pray that you join me by supporting the participants and team of #191 with your prayers, palanca and your attendance at the Clausura on Sunday, October 16th at 2:30pm to welcome them into their 4th Day!
