This program provides that the American Legion Orville Jackson Post 127, Eagle Idaho will display the American Flag at your place of business on 13 major flag days during the year (except during inclement weather or possible hanging night before).

Orville Jackson Post 127 will display and remove the American Flag at your place of business on the days noted above. We ask that you and your employees do not remove the flag. Our members will be fully responsible for its removal and storage. If the flag is stolen, we accept full responsibility of the flag, not you.
