ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL/CORPORATION MEETING

Also, from the floor four members of the congregation will be elected as members-at-large for the Nominating Committee of 2026.

During the corporation meeting the Nominating Committee will present the nominees for a Trustee in the class of 2028, President of the Corporation, Secretary of the Corporation, and Financial Secretary. A review of the 2026 budget will be presented. All active members of the congregation are encouraged to attend.

ROUND HILL CHURCH HISTORY NOTES

Our past is an honorable one – made so by committed Christians – both clergy and lay – who gave unselfishly of their time and talents to make Round Hill a church that would be strong enough to reach out to the community as God's service here. Our prayer is that as we face the future, the Holy Spirit will continue to guide and direct all who minister and worship here.

Round Hill is the product of her past: each pastorate has provided elements which we continue to develop.

"Go ye, therefore, and teach all nations."

Bicentennial year of 1778, plans are underway for the celebration of our own Bicentennial. The History Committee, chaired by Beverly Harchelroad, is busy studying materials loaned by various members of the congregation. They are planning to publish small booklets, "Reminiscences" and "Historical Facts", as well as to prepare a history which will be included in a pictorial Church Directory. Others on the committee are Dorothy Guffey, Joe Hutchinson, Rev. Robert Guffey, Albert Gamble and Dawn Kight.

The Fa8r Committee, headed by Donn Kight, is planning a Free Fair for September 9, 1978. Craftsmen of all kinds from the E-F area will be invited to display and demonstrate their work. Entertainment and box lunches are planned. Also on the committee are Jim Brown, Betty Caldwell, Chiquita Hutchinson, Baba Werner and Bob Boback.

Special Services Committee, chaired by Rosella Leggett, is planning services from March 3 to November 22, 1978. Former ministers will be invited back; an historical service is planned and invitations to sister and daughter churches are being considered. Others on this committee are Graeme Sieber and Bob Leggett.

March 5, 1978: mortgage on the Christian Education Bldg. was paid off and papers were burned in a ceremony. Men of the church paneled the Social Room walls. A contract to level and tile floor in Social Room was sought, not to exceed \$1,400.

NEW WINDOWS ARE INSTALLED!

As you may be aware, one of our members (who wishes to remain anonymous) made a generous donation that has enabled us to replace all 6 of the lower windows in the CE building conference room. These windows are awning type that open at the bottom and have "lifetime" fiberglass frames and dual pane "low E" glass to help deflect the sun's rays that effect us so much in the afternoon. These windows will help somewhat with our electric heating bills as well.

Also helping with our heating bills is a Mini-Split heating and cooling system that has also been installed in our CE building, It will provide heating and cooling in the Conference Room, Secretary's Office, Lobby and Pastor's Office. The existing resistance heating system remains in place and can be used as a backup system.

Two other items that you may notice are new LED lights in the steeple and LED lights behind the Cross in the sanctuary. These are brighter, more energy efficient and longer lasting.

And thank God that that baby enjoys the good health that permits him to maintain a healthy cry, for there are some babies who cannot cry. And thank God for those parents who are raising that child in the church, for there are some who do not bring their children into Christian fellowship.

To the parents, in your discomfort as the parent of a crying child, know that a very poignant prayerful moment has been created for Old David Caird and some others, also. May God bless you and your baby.
