2025 Annual Congregational and Corporate Meeting

The annual meetings of the congregation and corporation of Round Hill Presbyterian Church were held on Sunday, December 21st after worship. Laurie Conley, Ben Thornton, and Lissa Wagner were elected as elders to serve in the Class of 2028, Diana Hicks in the Class of 2027, and Bonnie Craig in the Class of 2026. Barb Gaylord, Nancy Painter, and Tom Russell were elected as deacons to serve in the Class of 2028. Tim Guffey, Jackie Karnes, and Janice Turek were elected to serve as members-at-large on the 2026 Nominating Committee with one to be named later. During the corporation meeting the following positions were elected Trustee for the Class of 2028 Pat Conley, President of the Corporation Jackie Karnes, Secretary of the Corporation Tanya Jackson, Financial Secretary Tim Guffey, Auditor Janice Turek. Jackie Karnes reviewed the 2026 budget that the Session approved at its December meeting.

Session Notes:

On Monday, December 8th Session met and received the usual reports. The Session approved the 2026 budget as presented by the Trustees. They also approved the purchase of a new computer for the church office to replace the outdated one.

Discussion of preparing those interested in ways to present the gospel to folks they encounter will be one point of our outreach in the coming year.

The Nominating Committee presented the slate of elders, deacons and other officers to be nominated at the congregational/corporation meetings. We thanked those Session members who completed their three-year term, Bonnie Craig, Diana Hicks, and Lisa Wagner. Also, Elders Ron Minkus and Jesse Sandor, who passed away this year were remembered, and the work they have done.

Bob Leggett was elected Clerk of Session for 2026. If you have any concerns or questions, you are encouraged to speak with any member of Session. The next meeting will be on Monday, January 12th.

A LOOK BACK IN TIME



Round Hill Cemetery Notes

In keeping with the custom of those early days, the membership of Round Hill Church sought the comfort received by having departed loved ones being buried

close to their Church, so it was not too long until the tiny churchyard was dotted with the graves of departed members. We do not know how soon the first burial was made, but the earliest recorded burial was in 1786. It was not until 1883 that some of the members, being concerned with the necessity of providing for the internment of their own, and desiring that these places of rest receive perpetual care, met and organized the Round Hill Cemetery Company. The following is an exact quote of the minutes of that first meeting:

"Round Hill, March 17, 1883 – Pursuant to notice a number of the citizens concerned in the Round Hill Grave Yard met. On a motion, Frank Patterson, Esq., was called to chair and A. McKinley appointed Secretary. The following Resolutions were adopted on a motion of A. McKinley – resolved that a committee of six be appointed to obtain said charter. Resolved that Frank Patterson, Esq., Matthew Henderson, A. McKinley, David Nichols, John Guffy and Joseph Peairs constitute said committee. Resolved that the entire business of obtaining said charter be left with the committee. Adjourned Sine D, A. McKinley, Secretary"

The next meeting was held at Round Hill on June 23, 1883, and a portion of the minutes of that meeting follows: "Pursuant to the Board of Directors of the Round Hill Cemetery Company appointed by the court met and organized by electing Frank Patterson, Esq., President, William Caldwell, Vice President, and A. McKinley, Secretary.

Report of former meeting read and approved, when the following resolution was adopted on motion – “Resolved that the annual meeting of the Board of Directors be held on the last Saturday of October at which time the minutes of the said company shall elect three members for three years, three for two years, and three for one. ”

The first mention of any additional land being acquired is noted at the meeting held on August 11, 1883. The minutes record that the Board viewed land to be added to the old church yard, and agreed to pay Mr. Peairs \$200 and also to give him a lot adjacent to the old family lot at the lower end of the ground. This is almost certain to be the first acres that were added to the old ground.
