A LOOK BACK IN TIME

March 1979 – Pittsburgh History and Landmark Foundation "awarded a plaque to Round Hill Sanctuary on the basis of its architectural importance to the county".

May 11, 1979 – Plaque made of native stone to match Round Hill Church's foundation was installed. Herb Howell designed, created and installed the plaque.

Fall of 1979 – Round Hill Food Pantry started and helped 6 families. Rev. Graeme Sieber, Baba Werner, Chiquita Hutchinson, Renee Keefer, Marjorie Scott and Marilyn Christenson were first members and volunteers of Food Pantry.

December 1982 – 25th anniversary of Boy Scout Troop 78 sponsored by Round Hill Church. Evan Leggett was honored as the first Scoutmaster and so far only Scoutmaster of the Troop.

March 1983 – First Men's Communion Breakfast held.

April 1983 – Telephone answering device installed in C.E. Bldg. Renovation of front wall of Sanctuary with an arch in memory of George Douglas started. Communion Table refinished.

January 1984 – Front wall in Sanctuary completed. Nancy Gorsuch hired as interim minister (January to August).

April 1985 – Manse renovated at a cost of \$3,160.

May 1985 – Gable roof installed on C.E. Bldg. Cost: \$29,880. Joll Construction Company was contractor.

April 1986 – Boy Scout Troop 78 has been at Round Hill for 29 years, with Evan Leggett as Scoutmaster. There have been 69 Eagle Scouts


Fall 1987 – John Karkoski cleaned and/or replaced protective covers on stained glass windows in Sanctuary.

October 1988 – Mark Neff hired as organist at Round Hill Church

August 1998 – Sanctuary roof replaced at a cost of\$14,225 by Ed Shook Contractor, Inc. Forty-year guarantee; copper gutters installed

July 2003 - 225th anniversary of Round Hill Church. Amazing Grace Dinner Theater production was set for August 22 - 23 and 29 - 30.

June 2004 – No Strawberry Festival held – first time since 1894!








We're Having a Picnic!!!
