Joint Development Planned for Florin Road Light Rail Station

Sacramento Regional Transit and its partners have been working with the community on planning what future development of the Florin Light Rail Station excess parking lot and property would look like.

RT has received interest from a number of developers with concepts ranging from market rate housing to partnerships between mixed-income housing and various service providers and businesses.
