Saving Bing Maloney **Golf Course**

Did you know that Bing Maloney Golf Course is one of three sites being evaluated for the potential relocation of the Sacramento Zoo? The other two possible locations are the Arco/Sleep Train Arena area and the Natomas Regional Park.

There is a grass roots group out of Natomas called WWAZ (#WeWantAZoo) that are working with District I Councilmember, Angelique Ashby, to have the Zoo relocated to the arena site.

The City's feasibility study may not go their way and the Bing Maloney Golf Course could be the chosen site. How do you feel about the Zoo relocating to your backyard?

Did you know that the City states that there are too many City golf courses and Bing Maloney Golf Course is the one they are discussing to eliminate over the others? They say it is not cost effective to spend money on the course.

Our Neighborhood Brand

Golf Course Terrace Estates has its identity tied to the golf course as reflected in the name of our neighborhood and the many streets that are named after golfing greats. Take away Bing and we lose our identity!

Our community has access to a beautiful 18-hole and 9-hole golf course at a low cost. To take this away would be stripping our community and other surrounding communities of resources we have enjoyed. The facilities should be upgraded - as most all the other City golf courses have very nice clubhouse facilities. It is time for the City to invest in our community.

If you think that having our neighborhood golf course STAY a neighborhood golf course, now is the time to act and preempt the changes that could come.

Having an emergency kit of supplies ready and on hand for an emergency is a good idea. Here are some things to consider putting in your individual or family "Ready To Go Kit".

READY TO GO KIT

DRINKING WATER: I gallon of water per person, per day TOOLS & UTENSILS: Non-electric can opener, forks, spoons & knives FOOD: Non-perishable, easy to prepare food. Don't forget baby and Fido. FLASHLIGHT: Do not use candles RADIO: Battery-powered or a hand crank weather radio EXTRA BATTERIES: Include two extra sets MOBILE PHONE: Include a portable charger

HEALTH AND PERSONAL SUPPLIES

FIRST AID KIT

Fron antibiotic ointments and bandages to cold packs and more

BLANKETS & CLOTHING

Blankets, warm clothes, sturdy shoes and heavy gloves

ACTIVITIES FOR CHILDREN

Toys, books, games

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

Copies of IDs, medical records, pet vaccinations an dfamily photos

MEDICATIONS & EYEGLASSES

Prescription and non-prescription

Soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, toilet paper, etc.

CASH & CREDIT CARDS

If possible, put aside at least \$100

OTHER USEFUL ITEMS

Paper towels, trash bags, multipurpose tools, Swiss army knife.

PLAN OF ACTION: A solid plan where family members will meet in case of evacuation.
