Woman Has "Loud and Full Body Orgasm" During LA Philharmonic Concert

The Ground Really Moved For One Woman During The Second *Movement* Of The LA Philharmonic's Performance Of Tchaikovsky's 5th Symphony — When She Experienced A "Loud And Full Body Orgasm."

Several Concertgoers Described The Woman's Climactic Moment Friday From The Balcony At The Packed Walt Disney Concert Hall.

"Everyone Kind Of Turned To See What Was Happening," Molly Grant, Who Was Sitting Near The Overjoyed Woman, Told The Los Angles Times On Sunday.

"I Saw The Girl After It Happened, And I Assume That She... Had An Orgasm Because She Was Heavily Breathing, And Her Partner Was Smiling And Looking At Her — Like In An Effort Not To Shame Her," She Said.

"It Was Quite Beautiful," Grant Added.

An Audio Clip Purporting To Capture The Woman's Moment Of Ecstasy Has Gone Viral.

British Composer Magnus Fiennes, Brother Of Actor Ralph Fiennes, Also Was In Attendance. "A Woman In The Audience Had A Loud And Full Body Orgasm During The 5th's Second Movement... Band Politely Played On," He Said On Twitter.

However, Some Social Media Users Expressed Their Doubts About The Incident, With One Who Was Present Suggesting That The Woman Had A Medical Emergency. [Ed. Note: One Would Think The Woman In Question Could Authoritatively Resolve That Question.

Presumably She Knows What She Experienced — Orgasm, Heart Attack Or Whatever-The-Pfuck - Jesus!]

Fiennes Insisted "It Absolutely Happened," Writing That He "Ran All The Possible Scenarios."

"Was In Close Proximity And No Less Than 8 Other Friends Coincidentally Attending — All Had Reached A Similar Conclusion. She Remained For The Rest Of The Show, Her Demeanor Was In Evidence. My Corroborated Take Is Merely Is Merely An Observation. Respect Maintained," He Said.

Classical Pianist Sharon Su Added In A Tweet That She "Checked With Someone Who Works At The LA Phil And They Confirmed" That The Incident Was Real And That The Orchestra Did Not Stop Playing During Tchaikovsky's 5th.

The LA Times Reported That It's Sources And The Audio Clip Corroborated The Accounts That The Orchestra Did Not Miss A Beat During The Explosive Moment.

It Noted That The Philharmonic's Online Program Notes Included The Following Description Of The Second Movement.

"The ... Luscious Main Theme Was Adapted For a Popular Love Song; Tchaikovsky's Skillful Orchestration, However, Lifts The Mood From Sentimentality To High Romanticism. The Movement's Principal Melody Is Presented In A Memorable Solo By The Horn, Followed By Other Appealing Woodwind Solos."

Music Agent Lukas Burton Told The LA Times That The Woman's Load Moan Was "Wonderfully Timed" To A "Romantic Timed" To A "Romantic Swell" During The Performance.

"One Can't Know What Exactly Happened, But It Seemed Very Clear From The Sound That It Was An Expression Of Pure Physical Joy," Burton Told The Paper.

"A Sort Of Classical Music Equivalent Of That Scene I A Movie Where Someone Is Talking Loudly In A Party Or A Nightclub, And The Record Suddenly Stops And They Something That Everyone Hears," He Said.

Burton Added That The Classic Expression Of Joy Was "Rather Wonderful and Refreshing."

He Said There Was "A Sort Of Gasp In The Audience" But That "Everyone Felt That Was A Rather Lovely Expression Of Somebody Who Was So Transported By The Music That It Had Some Kind Of Effect On Them.

The Times Said It Has Not Been Able To Identify The Woman And That The Philharmonic Did Not Immediately Respond To It's Request For Comment.

Over The Weekend, A Female Concert-Goer Apparently Had A Noisy "Full Body Orgasm" During LA Phil's Performance Of Tchaikovsky's 5th Symphony — Though The Band Continued Play Without Missing A Beat, Witnesses Told The LA Times.

But Other People At The Performance Claimed Her Caught-On-Tape Outburst Sounded Less Like A Steamy Climax Than A Cry For Help.

"I Was There... The Poor Woman Had A Breakdown Of Some Sort," Tweeted Composer Rodrigo Ruiz. "We Were All Worried It Was A Medical Emergency."

The [LA] Times Got It Wrong, It Seems," Another Observer Wrote, As Speculation Swirled Online.

But If The Mystery Woman Was In Fact Screaming In Pain Or Had A Mental Health Crisis, The City's EMS Services Never Heard A Thing About It, Prange Said.

Told About Reports That She May Have Simply Been Crying Out In Ecstasy, Prange Replied, "Good For Her."

The LA Phil And Ruiz Didn't Return The Post's Request For Comment Thursday.

"As I've Aged, I've Learned How To Sink Into The Moment And My Own Orgasms Are Markedly More Powerful Even As My Hormones Have Diminished," The Doctor Said — Who Also Operates A Service Named *Counseling Near Me* — Dished.

Sharing Her Techniques, She Told The Post: "Teasing A Partner And Delaying Orgasm While On The Brink Is A Primary Way To Build A Great Orgasmic Platform. Physiologically, This Means Loads Of Stop-Start Stimulation To Reach Full Vasocongestion Or Swelling.

Mentally, It Means Making Your Partner Crave Release So Hard That It Becomes Their Sole Focus."

The Term "Full-Body Orgasm" Has Garnered More Than Half A Billion Views On The App, When Sneaky Coded Hashtags Such As "Full Body Orgs" And "Full Body Orgsms" Are Taken Into Account.

Nutritionist @ Dungubook Has Clocked Up Tens Of Thousands Of Views Teaching Men How To Have One Of The Climaxes.

Like Watson, He Says It's All About Teasing And Timing.

In One Video, The British Content Creator Claimed "Edging," Or Stopping Stimulation Just Before Ejaculation, Helps Achieve A Full-Body Orgasm, As Well As Kegel Exercises, Which Involve Tightening And Holding The Pelvic Floor Muscles.

Meanwhile, Other TikTokers Say Full-Body Orgasms Are More Spiritual Than Sexual.

Content Creator Leán Bakker Stated In A Recent Video: It Is Some Much More Than Sex. It Is Realization Of The Pleasure Force Inside Yourself And You Are Able To Feel God Inside Your Body."

Meanwhile, Life Coach Lisa May Francisco Recently Went Viral Describing How She Achieved Her First "Cosmic Full Body Orgasm" Without Touching Her Nether Regions.

Francisco Explained That She Experienced The Sensation During A Breath Work Class, In Which She "Worked Through Her Chakras.

"I Felt This Rush Of Pleasure Pulsating Through My Whole Through My Whole Body At A Cellular Level," Francisco Told The Post In An Interview On Tuesday.

There Was No Sexual Component," She Added. "It Was Just This Divine Connection And Oneness With Myself And The Life Force Energy That Is Within Every Living Being On This Planet. I Felt My Whole Body Tingling Especially My Yoni [Genital] Area."

A 'Full Body Orgasm' At The LA Phil?

Witnesses Offer Conflicting Accounts. Hear What Happened During Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 5 From Other Concertgoers

Molly Grant Was Enjoying The Los Angeles Philharmonic's Performance Of Tchaikovsky's Fifth Symphony On Friday At The Walt Disney Concert Hall When She Heard What She Described As A "Scream/Moan" Erupt From The Balcony.

"Everyone Kind Of Turned To See What Was Happening," Grant, Who Was Seated Near The Person Who Allegedly Made The Noise, Told The Times On Sunday In A Phone Interview."

"I Saw The Girl After It Happened, And I Assume That She ... Had An Orgasm Because She Was Heavily Breathing, And Her Partner Was Smiling And Looking At Her — Like In An Effort To Not Shame Her," Said Grant, Who Works For A Jewelry Company And Lives In Los Feliz. "It Was Quite Beautiful."

Multiple People Who Attended The LA Phil Concert On Friday Reported Hearing A Woman Making A Moaning Noise During The Symphony's Second Movement.

One Attendee, Composer And Music Producer Magnus Fiennes, Described The Sound On Twitter As That Of A Person Having "A Loud And Full Body Orgasm."

An Alleged Audio Recording Of The Moment — Where Someone Can Be Heard Crying Out During A Quiet Beat In The Music — Was Making The Rounds On Social Media.

Attendees Who Spoke To The Times Said That The Clip Was Similar To What They'd Heard.

"[F]riends Who Went To The LA Philharmonic Last Night Are Reporting That In The Middle Of The Show Some Lady Had A SCREAMING Orgasm, To The Point Where The Whole Orchestra Stopped Playing," Tweeted Journalist Jocelyn Silver. "Some People Really Know How To Live ..."

However, People In Attendance Said That The Musicians Played Through The Disturbance Without Stopping. Classical Pianist Sharon Su Tweeted That She "Checked With Someone Who Works At The Phil And They Confirmed" That The Orchestra Continued Playing Through The Commotion.

The Times Has Since Confirmed That The Orchestra Kept Performing And That There Were No Further Disruptions.

It Is Still Unclear What Exactly Occurred In The Audience. The Times Has Contacted The LA Phil For Comment But Has Not Been Able To Identify Or Contact The Person Who Made The Sound.

Other Audience Members Disputed The Orgasm Theory, Offering That The Woman Could Have Made The Noise While Waking After Having Fallen Asleep. Some Worried That It Could Have Been Related To A Medical Condition Or Emergency.

One Attendee Who Was Seated In The Row Directly Behind The Person Who Made The Noise Said It Appeared As If The Woman Was Waking Up From A Sleep Attack When She Made The Sound.

"Pretty Quickly, She Sort Of Fell Onto Her Partner's Shoulders, And Then Onto His Lap. And Then Her Body Went Limp," Recalled The Audience Member, Who Requested Anonymity To Discuss The Incident. "Maybe Like Five Seconds Later, She Kind Of Awoke, And That's When She Let Out A Scream.

The Audience Member Who Was Seated In The Row Behind The Person Said She Had Previously Witnessed A Person With Narcolepsy Experience A Sleep Attack, And What She Saw At The LA Phil Seemed Similar.

After The Woman Made The Noise, Her Partner And Another Woman Seated Next To Her Asked If She Was OK, And She Replied That She Was, According To The Audience Member, Who Reported Overhearing The Exchange.

"I Know Someone Else Mentioned She Was Smiling, But I'm Pretty Sure She Was Just Really Embarrassed Because Other People Were Looking At Her, The Audience Member Told The Times.

Another Concertgoer Emailed The Times To Say He Heard The Noise But Did Not Think It Was A Sound Of Ecstasy.

Friday's Program, Led By Conductor slim Cham, Also Included A Performance Of Thomas Adés' "Concentric Paths" Violin Concerto.

The LA Phil's Online Program Notes Include This Description Of The Second Of Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 5:

Silver Lake Resident And Music Agent Lukas Burton Said The Sound From The Audience Member Was "Wonderfully Timed" To A "Romantic Swell" In The Symphony.
