MODULE A2 OBSESSIVE COMPULSIVE DISORDER (OCD)

CODES FOR MODULE A2:

0 = Absent or non-significant

1 = Symptom present

A positive rating of 1 implies that the patient has the symptom more than most people, or has at least some distress, or seeks professional help.

Blank = missing data or unsure, unless otherwise specified in the question.

Questions apply to the past week, unless otherwise specified by the interviewer.

<p><i>OCD1. Do you have an intrusive thought or image that does not make sense and keeps coming back to your mind even when you try not to have the thought or the image?</i></p> <p>0 Patient has no obsessions. 1 Patient has obsessions less than 1 hour/day. 2 Patient has obsessions 1-4 hours/day. 3 Patient has obsessions more than 4 hours/day.</p>	0.85

OCD2. During a one week period, on how many days do you have obsessive thoughts on average?

(# of days from 0 to 7)

OCD3. AGGRESSIVE OBSESSIONS

0 Patient has no aggressive obsessions.

1 Patient has aggressive obsessions.

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OCD4. CONTAMINATION OBSESSIONS (e.g. dirt, germs)

- 0 Patient has no contamination obsessions.
- 1 Patient has contamination obsessions.

OCD5. SEXUAL OBSESSIONS

- 0 Patient has no sexual obsessions.
- 1 Patient has sexual obsessions.

OCD6. RELIGIOUS OBSESSIONS

- 0 Patient has no religious obsessions.
- 1 Patient has religious obsessions.

OCD7. SOMATIC OBSESSIONS (CONCERNED WITH DISEASE)

- 0 Patient has no somatic obsessions.
- 1 Patient has somatic obsessions.

OCD8. APPEARANCE OBSESSIONS

- 0 Patient has no appearance obsessions.
- 1 Patient has appearance obsessions.

OCD9. OTHER OBSESSIONS

- 0 Patient has no other obsessions.
- 1 Patient has other obsessions.

<p><i>OCD10. Do you find that you have to do things over and over, that is, checking things you have done (such as washing your hands even if they are clean, checking doors or repeating mental acts such as counting or praying)?</i></p> <p><i>Do you get very anxious or tense if you do not repeat the act over and over?</i></p> <p>0 Patient has no compulsions. 1 Patient has compulsions less than 1 hour/day. 2 Patient has compulsions 1-4 hours/day. 3 Patient has compulsions more than 4 hours/day.</p>	0.77

OCD11. During a one week period, on how many days do you have compulsive behavior on average?

(# of days from 0 to 7)

OCD12. CHECKING COMPULSIONS

- 0 Patient has no checking compulsions.
- 1 Patient has checking compulsions.

OCD13. CLEANING/WASHING COMPULSIONS

- 0 Patient has no cleaning/washing compulsions.
- 1 Patient has cleaning/washing compulsions.

OCD14. REPEATING COMPULSIONS (e.g. re-reading, re-writing, re-entering house)

- 0 Patient has no repeating compulsions.
- 1 Patient has repeating compulsions.

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OCD15. ORDERING/ARRANGING COMPULSIONS

- 0 Patient has no ordering/arranging compulsions.
- 1 Patient has ordering/arranging compulsions.

OCD16. HOARDING/COLLECTING COMPULSIONS

- 0 Patient has no hoarding/collecting compulsions.
- 1 Patient has hoarding/collecting compulsions.

OCD17. MENTAL COMPULSIONS (e.g. praying, counting, repeating words)

- 0 Patient has no mental compulsions.
- 1 Patient has mental compulsions.

OCD18. OTHER COMPULSIONS

- 0 Patient has no other compulsions.
- 1 Patient has other compulsions.
