Important show info:

- Concession will be available onsite.
- No entries will be accepted after <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>July 9th</u> unless indicated on Facebook.
- In order for registration to be processed, waiver and registration form must be emailed in, as well as payment in full by etransfer to raslighthorse@gmail.com

Parking and stabling:

- Trailer tying. No electricity or indoor stabling available at this time. If you want to park on site overnight, please speak to the show director. No one may park overnight at Seager Wheeler Farm without permission of the show director.
- Please pick up manure in the holding area and put in wheelbarrow provided.
- Drinking water for horses will be provided.
- No horses are to be in grandstand area or in the walkway to Seager Wheeler buildings (beyond the Rosthern Ag Society picture board)
- *NEW* Outdoor pens are available for yearlings or 2-year-olds for free. If there are pens left over, they will be available for \$10/pen.

Directions to Seager Wheeler Farm:

If traveling on Hwy 11, turn East on Hwy 312 at Rosthern for 7km. Highway is newly paved! There is a sign for the farm. Turn North on the grid road for ½ km and the farm is on the right.

Take the 3rd entrance (just past main entrance) and park horse trailers in hay field north of the arena.

Spectators can park in the main Seager Wheeler parking, or west of the arena.

General Rules:

- 1. Classes may be split or combined based on the show committee's discretion.
- 2. No adding classes on the day of show. No refund will be given for scratched classes.
- 3. Any complaints must be submitted in writing to the Show Director by the end of the show day.
- 4. Placing with ribbons to 5th. Monetary prizes as follows:
 - a. 1st \$15.00, 2nd \$12.00, 3rd \$8.00, 4th 5.00
 - b. If a class has 3 or less riders, prize payout will be 1st \$8.00, 2nd \$5.00
 - c. Ranch Trifecta Jackpot will be paid out 80% of entries, at a rate of 1st 40%, 2nd 30%, 3rd 20%, 4th 10%
 - d. Jr Homesteaders and Leadline classes are free with no cash payouts.
- 5. The classes of Homestead Horse show will be judged according to SHF rules where applicable, AQHA rules where applicable (Ranch classes), and APHA rules where applicable (In-Hand Trail). See **Rule clarifications/exemptions** below.
- 6. All riders must be in the holding area in the arena and ready to enter the showring before their class. Competitors have 5 minutes for a tack change if gate person has been notified in advance.
- 7. All Youth are to wear ASTM/BSI approved helmets whenever they are sitting on their horse at any time during the show day, as well as during in-hand classes. Riders of all ages must wear an approved helmet for English classes.

- 8. Sick horses must stay home if your horse or another horse in your herd is showing any sign of illness, inform the show office prior to 8:00am on show day and your entries will be refunded. Entries will not be refunded for any other reason.
- 9. Good horse welfare means providing access to food and water throughout the day, as well as giving the horse sufficient breaks (unsaddled). Also, limiting the number of classes entered to a reasonable number based on the horse's current physical and mental abilities. The Show Committee reserves the right to dismiss or ban exhibitors from Homestead Horse Show for horse welfare misconduct.
- 10. Please practice good biosecurity while at the show. No sharing water buckets, avoid nose-to-nose contact of horses, etc.
- 11. The Judge or Show Director may dismiss a rider from the show ring/show for bad behaviour, safety concerns or lameness.
- 12. The walk/trot classes are for riders of all levels and horses of all ages that are currently unable to show at a lope. No cross entry between Walk/Trot classes and other classes, with the exception of Halter.
- 13. Horses' ages are as of Jan. 1st. Young Horse classes are for horses ages 5 and under. Riding horses cannot cross enter between 2-year-old In-Hand Trail and Yearling and 2-year-old Halter.
- 14. Well-mannered stallions can only be shown by adults. Please refer to our age divisions below as they may differ from other shows.
- 15. Competitors must compete in their Age Division as determined by the Year of Birth as it appears on their Birth Certificate. Any age may compete in Open classes.

Rule clarifications/exemptions:

- 1. Young riders ages 5 and up can choose between three options of classes:
 - a. Regular Youth classes like Western Pleasure Youth (which includes loping). These youth have the option of competing in Open Classes against adults;
 - b. Walk/Jog Youth classes like Western Pleasure Walk/Trot Youth;
 - c. *Jr Homesteaders classes* (#14-16) are limited to ages 5-12. The main difference is that in the Jr Homesteaders may have one adult ready to assist in the arena if needed. The show ring or barrel pattern size may be smaller as well. If a child is in those classes, they may not enter regular Youth or Walk/Jog Youth classes. There is no class fee for Jr Homesteaders, and prizes rather than payouts.
- 2. Youth riding 2-handed rule: Our goal is for all riders to eventually ride their older western horse in a shank bit and one-handed. However, for the safety of beginner youth who are just learning (whether in regular youth classes or walk-trot youth classes), we will allow for beginner youth to ride in a snaffle with two hands regardless of their horses' age. A beginner youth who is riding in a snaffle with two hands may not enter Open Classes such as Ranch and Trail Open. Any youth riding their horse in a shank bit must still ride one-handed.
- 3. **English attire:** We would like to encourage everyone to have a chance to try showing English, therefore we are slightly relaxing attire and tack rules. You must have an approved riding helmet with chin strap, but of any colour. You must have a solid coloured long-sleeve shirt (hunt coat optional), with breeches or riding tights, and riding boots or half chaps. Saddle blanket can be any English style of any colour.
- 4. **Ranch classes:** Will be judged according to AQHA class scoring. However, cross entry to general classes is allowed, because we would like to give our competitors an opportunity to challenge themselves or try new experiences. And realistically, we understand most of our locals do not have specialized ranch horses. But please consider animal welfare and refer to General Rule #9. Ranch tack and attire is encouraged but no points deducted or added for silver on tack, banded and trimmed mane, false tail, hoof black.
- 5. **Sharing horses**: We recognize good kids' horses are hard to come by, therefore a horse may be shared between family members. Please consider animal welfare and refer to General Rule #9.
- 6. **Command Class:** Western or English tack and attire are permitted for Command Classes.
