

The churchwardens and PCC have been in discussion with the diocese about a successor to David Harris as our local parish priest.

We are happy to announce that (despite the financial challenges of the pandemic) the diocese have agreed to continue funding a resident priest at Ilsington on exactly the same 'house for duty' basis as before.



Also, our aim in the Diocese of Exeter is now for every church to be part of a 'mission community'. This means a grouping of churches which can work in partnership to provide an offering to the local communities which is more effective than one parish and one (part-time) vicar can provide. The proposal which has been discussed with the Parochial Church Council is for Ilsington to join the Ashburton and Moorland Mission Community. This plan is warmly supported by the PCC and we look forward to working with them all.

As part of this we are delighted to announce that the Team Rector of the Ashburton & Moorland Team, the Right Revd Mark Rylands, has agreed to be appointed as additionally Priest-in-Charge of the parish while the process of consultation about a future link with that Mission Community gets underway. Mark will continue in his present role as Team Rector based at Ashburton and should the current plans come to fruition, in time he will become our overall Team Rector as well. In the view of the PCC, this gives Ilsington much needed stability in the short term as well as being a good long term plan.

Village Shop Talk



A shop is a bit like a bicycle. It has to keep moving forwards, introducing new products and new technologies to reflect the requirements of today's consumer, but many, perhaps most of us, don't think about it when we do our everyday shopping. We know where the things we usually buy are to be found in the shop, and our eye slides over any small changes. At least, mine does. I couldn't avoid a big change such as the new chillers with their expanded range of vegetables, dips, etc, but the other day I took the time to look around, and realised that there were several new products that reflect, the way in which society is changing. Take the card display: you might notice that Whistlefish cards don't have plastic wrappers. In the corner, above the display of soaps, oils, and so on from the Dartmoor Soap Company, you will find beeswax wraps that do the same job as clingfilm, and over on the hardware shelf there are paper sandwich bags that will do the same job as plastic bags. Small changes, yes, but reflecting the realisation that society as a whole is adding plastic to the environment more quickly than the environment can process it, so that any way in which we can remove plastic from the beginning of the cycle is worth thinking about.

I also found a new display of gluten-free and vegan foods, and I would have found a new selection of frozen ready meals, but I discovered that the freezers had broken down. Katherine, the shop manager, tells me that with a bit of luck they should be replaced by the time you read this article; it's only a wobble in the bicycle's progress.

LSINGTON VILLAGE SHOP Recipe Book

Easy to Make Roasted Tomato and Pepper Soup (Makes 3 portions)

Ingredients

Two red peppers Two medium sized red onions Four largish tomatoes Six cloves of garlic (if you prefer to use garlic purée out of a tube this will work as well) Olive oil.

Prepare peppers and onions and then cut in half. Cut tomatoes in half. Place in suitably sized oven proof baking dish. Sprinkle olive oil over them. Slow roast in oven at 160 degrees. (Ovens vary so select appropriate temperature for vour oven.)



Once the peppers start to colour add the garlic cloves and cook for a further 15 minutes. Remove dish from oven and drain off olive oil. (Now add garlic purée, to taste, if using it.) Place in saucepan with one crumbled vegetable stock cube and enough water to almost cover the vegetables. Gently simmer for 15 minutes then thoroughly liquidise before serving, ensuring your soup is piping hot.

Mark was formerly Diocesan Missioner in this diocese and a residentiary Canon of Exeter Cathedral, before moving to Shropshire to become Bishop of Shrewsbury twelve years ago. In 2018 he moved back to Devon in order to realise his long-term aim of spending the final stage of ministry before



retirement as a parish priest once again. He is married to Mandy (a Prebendary Emeritus of Exeter Cathedral and former Director of Ordinands in this diocese) and they have two adult children. Mark will be licensed by the Bishop of Plymouth at a special service at St Michael's on Monday 4th October at 7:30pm, to which all are invited.

Once in post, the plan is for Mark Rylands to appoint a house-for-duty colleague to live at Ilsington Vicarage and take primary responsibility for leading worship and pastoral care in our parish. This means the individual appointed will be committed to taking services on Sundays plus the equivalent of at least two days' ministry each week. The post will be advertised in the autumn with a view to a new priest moving to Ilsington in the early part of 2022. In due course, if current plans come to fruition our new resident priest will become Team Vicar in the Ashburton & Moorland Team.

The normal practice in the Ashburton & Moorland mission community is to have local parish services on the first four Sundays in each month and when there is a fifth Sunday, to meet together for worship at a different church in the mission community in rotation.

You can see that the next such occasion will be Sunday 31st October when we will be welcoming the churches of the Ashburton & Moorland Team to St Michael's for the 10.30 service. Peter Dickinson HE WEATHERMAN SAYS...



The year so far has been, to say the least pretty interesting. May was one of the wettest months on record and the rest of the summer has been mediocre at best. August was really cloud with no real warm days. It was not until early September that we had some warm days. So far September has been overall mixed and so far, dry as was August. It was interesting to see how much growth there has been this year with the hedges overflowing with growth. Most of us would have been out cutting the grass more often than usual.

A real problem this year has been blight and I have had many reports of tomato crops being devasted. Unless you had a well-ventilated greenhouse the chances are you lost the lot. Runner beans were very varied and if you were able to get them established before the end of July they have cropped very well. The fertilisation rate has been excellent due to the cool days and therefore long-lasting flowers. Unless we cop a hurricane September through to October looks normal.

Globally the weather has been extreme at times with hurricane IDA causing mayhem in the USA. IDA was the sixth costliest hurricane on record and the rainfall in New York historic and devastating.

Much has been written about the effects of climate change and there seems to be a general recognition that the increasing frequency of major weather events is linked to global warming. I have just picked up a news item posted on the BBC that the number of days when 50C or above is

reported has doubled in the last ten years. There is little doubt that this trend will continue.

So, what does that mean for our local climate? Thanks to our proximity to the sea the parish of Ilsington has an equitable climate and even though maximum summer temperatures will gradually increase they should not become excessive by the standards of other more vulnerable places. The biggest impact will be on rainfall and the number of wet days. The reason for this is quite straightforward, warmer air holds more moisture so you would expect the number of wet days to increase and the annual rainfall reflects this.









Sunshine is delicious, rain is refreshing, wind braces us up, snow is exhilarating; there is really no such thing as bad weather, only different kinds of good weather. ?







BIRDING ARTICLE

October is one of my favourite two months of the year. Both October and May are characterised by the climax of autumn and spring bird migration respectively and the ability of both seasons to produce surprising, even amazing avian gems out of the blue.

In addition, October is often characterised by tumultuous weather when fast moving Atlantic depressions sweep through in a couple of days to be followed by a similar period of sunny, calm, balmy days. The latter are spent by birders looking for birds brought in by the storm. Admittedly such prizes are almost always found at coastal migration hotspots, of which Devon has several of national renown, but surprises can and do appear inland.

A year ago I was thrilled to intercept a calling Yellow-browed Warbler as it passed through my garden in Sigford. If I hadn't known its call and been nearby during the few minutes during which it was foraging for insects in the hawthorns by the house, this tiny white and olive warbler from the Himalayas would have slipped by undetected.

Just outside the Parish a "megatick" (not a giant bloodsucking mite but a new bird, of huge rarity, for many twitchers) was found at Stover Country Park in 2000. Although this tiny, secretive and cryptically patterned crake (like a minute, camouflaged Moorhen) emerged in front of a birder looking for Treecreepers in January 2000, the 9th Sora to have ever been seen in Britain by then, had almost certainly been brought in by a storm during the famously productive October of 1999. Enormously rarer than my warbler this was also miles inland.

On still October nights the sound of migration is easily heard, making me imagine what mouth-watering birds could be flying over or even dropping down to our parish. The sound I am referring to is the soft "tseep" of Redwings arriving from Scandinavia, under the cover of darkness, during October. They spend the winter around Ilsington (like all farmland parishes) but what if they had scooped up a lost Naumann's Thrush from China, which I might find hopping about with them in one of Rob Wills' pastures at Narracombe on the next sunny October afternoon....? This is yet another aspect of the magic of birdwatching; it is certainly true that anything can turn up anywhere. If you keep your eyes and ears open for long enough you can get lucky and you just might hit the jackpot one day.

HE POST BOX continued.....

Following on from the article from Rob Wills about the post box from Ilsington that was re-located to Narracombe farm, here is further detail about the post box from Derek Honeywill.

Derek's mother and father lived originally at Simms Hill. When numbers one and two Shamrock cottages had been newly renovated by Captain Quelch, Derek's father said that they wanted to move into number two shamrock cottages, but Captain Quelch thought that number one would be more suitable for the family. (Shamrock Cottages were the first

properties in the village to be renovated). Derek's father Arthur was a boot and shoe maker, and number one Shamrock cottages had, once you opened the front door a small lobby, two further doors, one to the main part of the house and stairs, and the other door to a separate downstairs room. Captain Quelch thought that this separate room would be good for Derek's dad to use for his business, and keep it separate from the family home.

The family therefore moved into number one Shamrock Cottages.

Derek Honeywill was born at one shamrock cottages, and his mother May being very happy there lived in the house for 60 years until she died. So, where you ask is the connection to the post box...



in his shop

Well, the original site for the post box mentioned in Rob Wills article, before it was moved to Sanctuary Cross, was actually in the corner of the wall of number one Shamrock cottages. The walls of one Shamrock Cottages are made of cob and two and a half feet thick, making them very suitable for the inset post box! So if you look very carefully at the render on the wall of the cottage, just where the wall joins to number two, you can still see the outline of where the post box used to be. **Thank you very much to Derek Honeywill for providing this detail.**

ARTMOOR BYE LAWS changing



The current set of byelaws regulating access on the commons have been in place since 1989. They are now 32 years old and in that time there have been legal, practical, technological and societal developments.

The byelaws need updating to better reflect modern needs, improve public understanding and address issues which have the potential to damage the National Park's special qualities.

The review aims to ensure the byelaws are updated to be:

Relevant and proportionate for modern society

Clear and easy to understand

Cover the right activities and areas

Complement other powers and legislation.


The Authority's Director of Conservation and Communities Alison Kohler said: "The Authority has agreed to consult on revisions to the National Park byelaws. We are doing this to ensure the byelaws are fit for purpose and help protect the National Park for all to enjoy today and tomorrow.

"Updating the byelaws is an important topic for everyone who cares about Dartmoor whether it's landowners, commoners, residents, businesses or visitors, and we recognise people will want to have a say.

"Following Authority agreement, a draft set of byelaws will go out to public consultation from week beginning September 20. We're keen to hear a diverse range of views so we can develop byelaws that are relevant, clear, enforceable and enable people to enjoy Dartmoor, help look after it and 'leave no trace'."

The consultation will be publicised on the National Park's website, social media and by news release. People can subscribe to receive newsletters to stay updated. The consultation will remain open for six weeks. The following step is that the Authority will meet again to consider responses, agree appropriate changes and formally approve the byelaws. They'll then be sent to Defra for final confirmation.


