

Within just a few days of you receiving this copy of the parish magazine, we will be deeply involved with our churches' annual Easter celebrations. We're already in the season of Lent, and shortly we will be marking Palm Sunday, Good Friday and then 'Resurrection Sunday' itself. The 40 days leading up to Easter is a time of contemplative reflection and preparation for the event itself – and there is something comforting even in just knowing that the seasons are ticking around yet again whether or not we have chosen to 'give up' anything during this time.

This year, I'm sure we have all been extra grateful for what we do have – despite the rising costs of living and the hike in fuel costs. When we look at what our Eastern European neighbours in Ukraine are going through, we realise what a privilege it is to even be able to drive or walk to our familiar and favourite local shops, even though it may be costing us more than it ever has done. While we all hope and pray for a swift end to this conflict the reality is that the impact of such violence and destruction will be felt for many, many years to come even if it were to end tomorrow.

It can be difficult when we are witnessing so much suffering, albeit at a distance through our TV screen, to feel that it is ok to take timeout for celebration and enjoyment. Nonetheless, we are rapidly approaching another festival season.

Perhaps this year of all years we should take the time to recognize - really, truly and deeply recognize - that Easter is not about chocolate eggs ... and it is not about family gatherings or extra days off work (although, all those are gratefully received and appreciated!) nor is it another excuse to stay late at the pub or to party, or even about the Easter Bunny. It is about the love of God for his creation - particularly for us, His children.

#### The Power of Prayer

Perhaps by the time you read this, some form of peace will have been negotiated in Ukraine. Whether or not that is the case, people directly affected by the war will still need our support, both practical and spiritual.

A vigil for Ukraine was held in the church on the 4th March with readings and prayers chosen for the occasion, as well as time for private prayer. Yellow and blue luggage labels have been left in the church for anyone to write a prayer or other words of support. These are gathered up regularly and committed to God at our services.

Some may feel that prayer is a futile gesture, but Christians believe that God hears our prayers and responds to them. Additionally, the people of Ukraine are asking the rest of the world not to forget them and to pray for them. It is the least we can do.

It is interesting that at times of stress, hardship, sorrow and danger, there is something in us all, believers or not, that can cause us to turn to God for help, even if prayer is not something we do regularly.

The Psalmists in the Bible used their poetry to praise God and thank God as well as expressing their anger towards him. But even in those Psalms of 'lament', they never lost their faith that God would stand by them and ultimately deliver them from their troubles.

Psalm 83 is a good example. Here the writer is pleading with God to listen to him because of what the enemies of Israel were doing to his people.

#### The Complete(d) Penn-Gaskells

As mentioned in my earlier article about Winifred Penn-Gaskell and her antecedents I have been able to identify activity relating to her two brothers both of whom died before Winifred. Both brothers were commemorated in St Pancras Church by Winifred.

Brother William Penn-Gaskell, born in 1871 was the eldest of the three Penn-Gaskell children and was a 'military man'. He served in South Africa in the early 1900's teaching Musketry to troops stationed in the Orange Free State. At the outbreak of the First World

War he returned to military service in Europe and served with the 25th Battalion Manchester Regiment. It was during his time with this regiment he was 'killed in action' during the infamous "Battle of the Somme" in October 1916.



The younger brother Percy Charles (who was born in 1879) joined the East India Company after completing his education. From October 1899 he lived in Bengal. Percy trained as an engineer and in due course was appointed 'executive engineer' in 1908. With the outbreak of war in 1914 Percy undertook military service in India. He served as a Second Lieutenant interpreter in the Interpreter Corps. Percy Charles Penn-Gaskell died in Kent in 1937.

To round off the Penn-Gaskell saga here are a few more snippets about Winifred gleaned from local newspapers of the time. To help compile her (Continued on page 15)

#### Churches, Chapels, Communities, and visitors working together.

As many know we are a group of nine Anglican and three Methodist churches or chapels, hopefully all working together as a team.

But perhaps even more importantly we want to serve our rural communities, by both meeting their spiritual needs and reaching out to connect with and support all who either live on or visit Dartmoor.

February and early March for St Raphael's has demonstrated that when a Church or Chapel becomes central to the emotional and spiritual wellbeing of all who visit, the rewards for all are positive and inspiring.

The Forest Inn has reopened and the support from the licensee and owner has stimulated both visits to St Raphael's and help raise funds for its upkeep. For example, the distribution to Inn visitors of Parish Link magazines; having a collection box for the Chapel on the bar; supporting the sale of Visitors to Pilgrims brochures and finally for hosting, (to a packed pub!), a quiz night for St Raphael's which raised £125.

Then we provided refuge and shelter, i.e. warmth, a place of safe haven, and a bedroom and toilet (!), for more than 20 Duke of Edinburgh's Award (D. of E.) participants on a 'bleak' weekend in March. The Award helps young people build life-long belief in themselves - so the young, cold and wet expedition teams from schools throughout the region found themselves in Huccaby! As a 'thank you', for our sanctuary they – well actually their teachers and leaders - contributed to our heating and lighting costs.

We also had a very successful 'snowdrop campaign' with all forms of media coverage. This attracted literally many hundreds if not thousands of people to St Raphael's – we can count many of them as they donated using the contactless 'Sum-up' machine. The machine alone took over £850 in donations.


Finally, of course we held our traditional 'Cream Tea'. With the unstinting support from locals in baking cakes and scones, waitressing, washing up etc., we actually ran out of scones by 3.40pm! There were Church Wardens and PCC members present from across the Benefice – a very positive aspect in terms of our team communication.

Given the involvement of so many in a successful 4 weeks, it was not surprising that St Raphael's benefitted from over £3,417 being raised in donations in that short period. (And that's not counting our 'regular' and significant monthly donations from the Parish Giving Scheme.)

Thank you to all our volunteers, supporters and visitors for your generous contributions of the precious resource of your time - and even donations!

Long prayers are not needed to smile at Christ in the smallest details of daily life."





The Penn-Gaskell cup is still competed for by the bell-ringers of Widecombe and Moretonhampstead.

#### Extracts from the meeting on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2022

#### Vision Zero South West Grant

The Council has been awarded a grant for £6306, for a project to implement a number of road safety measures aimed at reducing the number of road traffic collisions and animal deaths on the B3212 between Dousland and Princetown. Cllr Mark Williams has recently taken on the project and is contacting Devon County Council Highways along with other stakeholders and graziers. The road safety measures will include reflective neck bands for cattle and ponies (following their success in the New Forest), new road signs at the cattlegrids at Peek Hill and Plymouth Hill, and a new VAS (Vehicle Activate Sign) to be positioned near Leden Tor car park.

#### Play Park Equipment & Entrance

A replacement seat assembly has been sourced for the Zip Wire.

Following the recent wet weather, the pedestrian entrance to the play park has become very muddy. The Lengthsman has been tasked with laying paving slabs to solve this issue, and provide a cleaner and safer entrance/exit to the play park.

#### **Princetown Parking Issues**

Residents raised concerns over a small number of vehicles which are permanently parked/abandoned on roads or in laybys in and around the village. Council reminded them that any member of the public can report abandoned (untaxed) vehicles to West Devon Borough Council, who in certain circumstances are then able to remove the vehicles. <a href="https://www.westdevon.gov.uk/article/6564/Abandoned-Vehicles">https://www.westdevon.gov.uk/article/6564/Abandoned-Vehicles</a>

#### **Climate Change Declaration**

The Council has taken the decision to plant two trees, as part of the Queens Green Canopy initiative. Sites within Princetown are being investigated, with a view to planting the trees as soon as practical and unveiling a plaque at the Jubilee Celebrations in June.

#### **CCTV Princetown**

Cllr Worth reported that all four cameras were in operation and that the UPS (Uninterruptible Power Supply) fitted in January had coped well with the power outages that occurred during recent storms Franklin and Eunice.

#### Two Bridges Proposed No Waiting Zone – Public Consultation

The Council has been aware of the issues regarding irresponsible parking on that stretch of road since mid-2020, when it was raised by a local resident. Since then, the Council has been involved, along with Devon County Council, Dartmoor National Park Authority and other authorities, in finding a solution. The Council agreed to respond to the public consultation stating that it strongly supported the proposal.

#### **News from the East Shallowford Trust**

'Miss, I don't know how you do this, week in and week out. This is just brilliant............ look at these kids. It's just brilliant', said Mr Dunkley having helped Will haul three secondary school children out of the marsh, which had done it's very best to suck them down to the very bowels of the earth. You can imagine the yelps, the screeches, the ............. sluuuuup sound as the rich, black, globulous peat grabs desperately, tenaciously, vindictively, onto the wellie boots of these poor kids who have no leg strength, no balance to outwit the chuckling, evilly, sucking, leg swallowing bog!

I hate bogs' said one girl having lost both wellies, which were eventually retrieved by David's strong, long arms. Her own arms flapped wildly resembling a Quentin Blake caricature of rage, frustrated relief combined with comic fury as she had made it out alive. She had concurred near death – or what felt like it as stomped into the yard, flapping, her overly long green rubbery plastic overalls and trousers splattered in smelly black bog, hair everywhere, kicking off wellies to reveal stinky black socks that she hopped madly around in as David carefully hosed her down before she could enter the boot room for a change of clothes. Luckily, she had enough layers for something to be dry underneath before she

made a quick dash upstairs for clean trousers and socks.

All fun and games in the wild of Dartmoor!

So Mr Dunkley's question of 'I don't know how you do this?' The programme planning is easy — Will, Serena, Ellie and Nick carry an encyclopaedia of activities in their heads that we trawl through, use and adapt at the last minute pending weather, emergencies, animals, season etc. What we do not have is a huge reserve of teaching staff. Simply....... we still cannot afford to recruit, meaning many of us work 12-14 hour days. Our team is dedicated to say the least! For the moment we have to bide our time, work with what we have and make it through the remainder of this year until we hopefully can recruit more staff to rotate mornings, evenings and weekends when needed. For this of course, we need money we do not yet have.

Cooking: maths, science, history & nutrition all in one lesson.

The last few groups have come from Bristol, interspersed with our regular visitors from Providence House in London. This last group was a senior school. The teachers carefully selected the children they wanted to reward for having made an effort since September, bringing twenty-eight children from three different year groups. Three children's parents changed their minds on the morning of the trip. A combination of scared, very protective parents and COVID has increased the level of reluctance and fear, not only within children's own heads but parent's whose own experiences are limited or negative.

Both teachers had whispered on arrival, 'These kids come from THE most deprived area in Bristol.' But they were brilliant, absolutely brilliant! They did not all know each other, but they helped eat up almost every morsel left on a plate (this group may win our 'least wastage' competition), they shared scarves, hats, hoddies, pulled each other out of gorse bushes, pushed each other up hills, raced each other at sweeping out the pig muck and forking out silage for the cows. As both Serena and Ellie said quite independently as I washed up dinner plates, 'I wish I could take one home....... they are sooo sweet!'

Miss Lazar talked seriously to them all, ran a daily 'star' competition ensuring that at least every child throughout the week gained a positive for some activity, but hauling them up if they missed a please, or thank you or did not help. The leaders in any group are key for a successful trip and on this occasion the two staff were superb!

In the last few minutes the group gathered in the Ark, home shoes and their own coats back on. One very thoughtful young lad looked at me and asked, 'Do you get paid for doing this?' 'Some of us do,' I replied, 'some volunteer, but we work longer hours than we are paid for.' So, I turned to the group as they cuddled the latest batch of chicks and said their farewells to Mini, 'Do you all know that we are a charity? Do you know what that means?' 'Yes' came the reply. 'So, it means, there is no profit, nothing extra to put in our pockets. Your group was paid for by some very nice people who think you should be given the chance to come to places like East Shallowford Farm.' To which there was a round of applause and whooping. 'This year, with electricity costs rising, fuel costs rising and all the rest, we will make a big loss which I'm not sure how we will cover. As you know, we also work with you from morning to night. So.............. Dylan has asked a question ............. is it worth David, Serena, Will, Ellie, Nick, Alethe and me working ALL these hours for you?' The answer took me quite by surprise. I was not just a 'yes' – but those not holding chicks spontaneously leapt up, off their chairs, whopped and yelled, 'Yeeeees!!' So there we had our answer!
