One of the best bits of life advice I ever heard someone give came from a ten year old child. The girl - we'll call her Sally - was consoling her friend - we'll call her Jenny. Jenny's parents were in the midst of a particularly acrimonious divorce and she was struggling with all the changes. "Why couldn't everything just stay as it was?! I don't understand!"

Sally gave her friend a hug and a tissue and said, "Thing is... you need to understand - things change. They just do. If you go through life expecting things not to change, then it's extra hard when they DO change. Sometimes things change for the worst sometimes they change for the better. But the good thing is that even when it feels like a bad change you can know that it won't last forever - because things always change!"

We all experience change in life at some point. Sometimes they are big changes, sometimes minor ones. Sometimes things change because we've decided they should - sometimes the change is beyond our control.

Personally, I've recently been through a change in being commissioned as a Church Army Evangelist. To find out more about what this means - and about the work of the Church Army - visit www.churcharmy.org. The area of Widecombe / Leusdon / Postbridge also face a change now that Geoffrey has left for a well-deserved retirement and the search begins for another Vicar to join the Team. Children in Y6 their primary schools, ready for secondary and Y11 and Y13 students will soon have their exam results and will be focusing on what comes next. As a nation we've all seen some significant change - a new King, new Prime Minister (or two... and counting?) - I wonder what the second half of this year will bring?

Think about the number of changes that you have gone through. Then multiply that by the number of people you know - the number of people in your town or village... the country... the world. And then think of that multiplied by the number of people alive over the past one hundred, two hundred years and back beyond that. It's a mind-blowing amount of change. Is the change you're going through more change than anyone has ever experienced?

God has a plan. Even when life changes and is confusing and chaotic and uncertain, we can rest assured that He has a plan. It is not a plan that is forced on to us but one that we can choose to engage with. And He 'gets it' when it's difficult and when we feel overwhelmed by what goes on around us.

Church Army Evangelist

After 18 months of discernment and then another 4 years of training, I've finally finished! On 18th July 2023, I was admitted to the office of Evangelist, and commissioned as a Church Army Evangelist.

But why?

'Evangelist' is one of the recognized roles within the church – it's there in the bible. Ephesians 4:11-12

"He himself granted that some are apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ..."

'He' is God; 'Saints' – any Christian; the 'body of Christ' – the church.

The word 'evangelist' is a very loaded one and people have preconceived ideas of what it means. But essentially, as this verse shows, the role of an Evangelist is to equip and build-up the church so that it can do the work that God intended. And what

is the work that God intended his church to do? Simply to share the Gospel message, the message of love, hope and reconciliation that we find brought to us through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

But, Evangelists existed a long time before Church Army – so why 'Church Army Evangelist'?

Church Army is an amazing organisation, full of people who are focussed on sharing God's love. It is part of the Church of England and carries the responsibility for training Evangelists and resources the wider church to be ready to share that gospel message. At a grass roots level, Evangelists are more likely to be found sharing God's love through practical demonstration than they are to be found preaching on street corners. That said, they do get involved with church leadership and some Church Army Evangelists also get ordained. I'm always happy to talk about the work of Church Army - or evangelism or faith and the church in general – so please do ask if you'd like to know more. Or visit the CA website: www.churcharmy.org

And so, on Tuesday, the Right Reverend Tim Thornton and Peter Rouch (CEO of Church Army) lead our commissioning service. We were all a little nervous – it was quite a formal occasion taking place in Sheffield Cathedral.



August is the traditional time, for families with school-age children at least, to have a holiday if they can afford it. I was very lucky as a child in that my parents saved hard to afford two weeks away, often in a tent or caravan and always somewhere in the British Isles.

Because my mother had been evacuated from London to Somerset during the war, she had lots of connections with the West Country. So, I have many happy memories of holidays in Devon and Cornwall including two weeks in a cottage in Ashprington near Totnes! This is part of the reason that Tony and I now live in Devon.

The concept of a holiday as a time of rest and recuperation originates from the Christian 'Holy Days' when the Church celebrates special festivals. Sunday is also a 'holy day' mirroring the Jewish Sabbath, a day that the Lord commanded should be a day of rest for his people. Although the Jewish Sabbath is now associated with all sorts of rules and regulations, the primary aim for both Jews and Christians is that there should be one day a week where you give your mind, body, and soul a chance to recover from the rigours and challenges of everyday life.

Although the Church holds most of its services on a Sunday, and for many years secular laws recognised the importance of keeping that day special with shops closed, for example, it does not mean that Sunday has to be the only 'holy day'. Otherwise, when would the clergy and other church leaders have an opportunity to take a break? And what about shift workers or all those people who have no choice but to work on a Sunday?

It is important for Christians to have a time when they focus on God, join together for worship and to learn more about their faith. Such time brings healing, renewal and the joy of celebrating God's love for us together. With or without a faith, giving ourselves a break from the 24/7 full-on culture that surrounds us, and enjoying leisure time with friends and families instead, is vital for everyone. As an update of an old joke goes - no-one has on their gravestone "I wish I'd spent more time at work or on my phone."

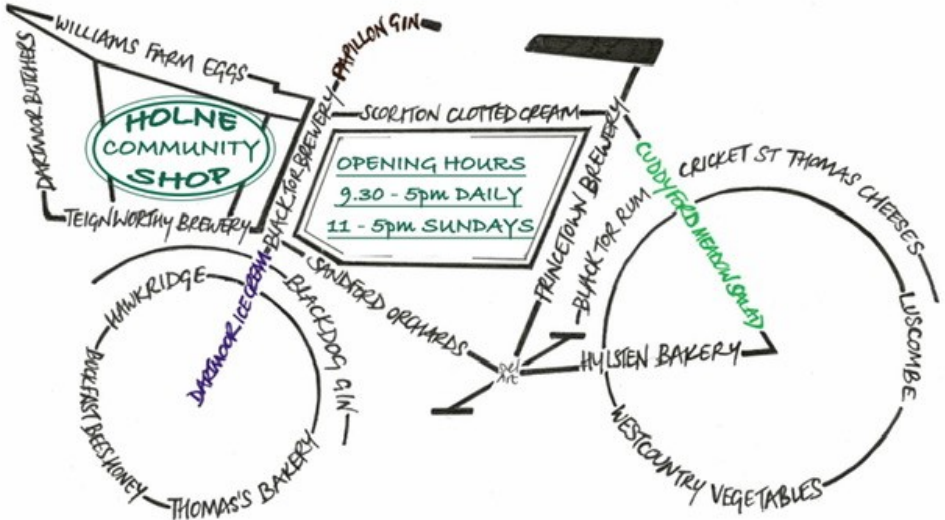

What is ordinary about this Trinity season?

The longest season in the Christian liturgical year is focussed on the Holy Trinity. In the Anglican church it begins on the Sunday after Pentecost - which is also called Whit Sunday - and runs until All Saints Day - also known as All Hallows - on 1 November.

This year the Trinity season began on Sunday 4 June and will last for 23 weeks, taking us through July, August, September, and October.

In some church traditions, including Anglican and Roman Catholic, the liturgical season of Trinity has traditionally been called '**Ordinary Time**' to distinguish it from the major celebrations of Christmas and Easter, and the times of penance during Lent and Advent. Surely, the Holy Trinity is not ordinary, which in today's vocabulary generally means with no distinctive features, or normal? Perhaps extraordinary would be a better modern term!

It is generally accepted that Tertullian (155-229 AD) was the first theologian to write about the Holy Trinity. Today, Tertullian is known as the father of Latin Christianity, which today represents the largest group within the Roman Catholic church. He is also known as the founder of Western theology and is most famous for being the first writer in Latin to use the term 'Trinity' (*Latin: trinitas*) to describe the complex nature of God. Strangely, even though many of his ideas are rooted in the liturgy used in both Eastern and Western churches today, he has never been recognised as a saint.

Perhaps good to learn something new every day?

While many in the UK will be hoping to make the most of the last days of summer during the August Bank Holiday, take a moment to remember St Augustine of Hippo, the patron saint of printers, sore eyes, brewers, and theologians – the sore eyes might include our Link editors and proof-readers, and the theologians - including our clergy!

St Augustine of Hippo's feast day is 28 August.

(Editors, publishers, proof-readers and printers must be in the need for a lot of prayer - because St John Bosco is also their patron Saint. His feast day is 31 January. Keep going Link team!)

Shallowford Farm
making the difference

To say that most of our groups are Primary School age would not actually be true. We will add it up at the end of the year – but, the last two groups were most definitely teenagers. Meaning? In a large group, some will miss the chance to truly lie down and engage with the soil, to hear the chatter of the trees, the birds and smell the sweetness of fresh air.... at least publicly! Some also, try to wriggle out of working with the pigs... 'It smells Sir! They are soooo loud!' and the amusement of course is that teenagers make A LOT of noise!

That is our real joy. When no other teen is looking, the hardest, toughest looking kid will sidle up and ask a truly sensible question, 'Why, if the sheep are in that field for a week, is there still some long grass?' or to the delight of Sarah, our new cook, 'Can I be on table laying and pick something for lunch please?' having heard from one of the previous day's activities.

I stand with a ladle over a pot of steaming chicken stew, 'Is this halal Miss?' 'Yes, it is. Killed here, last week. Would you like a lot or a little?' 'A lot' 'Sorry?' 'A lot please.' Food only comes with appropriate manners!

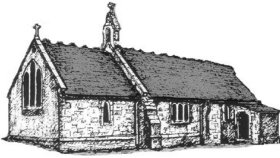

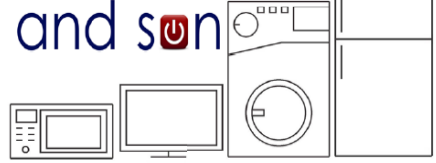

'Man made all this?' leading into a very good discussion on man's impact on earth that we pick up and follow through the week as we discuss climate change, food production, farming and humanities responsibility or perhaps more accurately, our dependence on our planet. The boys made it up the hill without a single whinge. One lad, almost weepy and withdrawn at the beginning of the week, was all smiles with offers of help by Wednesday. These 'turnarounds' are wonderful and more common than you could guess.



Extracts from the Council meeting on 27th June 202



Co-option of new Councillor: The Council is once again back to full strength following the co-option of Charmaine Clarke-Major in the Princetown Ward. The three new Councillors will be attending training sessions in the coming weeks, delivered by Devon Association of Local Councils, to ensure they understand the responsibilities of the Parish Council and their role within it.

Proposal to hold Pony Sale in Princetown: Charlotte Faulkner, Chair of Dartmoor Hill Pony Association attended and gave a short presentation on the proposal to hold a Pony Sale in Princetown in the Autumn, in addition to the Chagford sale. Princetown was considered due to its location, road network, 4g connectivity and has previously held the sale (although back in 1956). Councillors raised a number of concerns; about vehicular access to Jubilee Field and space for parking, and weather/ground conditions in late October. However, in general Council felt that this could be a positive event for the community once these issues were addressed.

Planning:

0235/23 at The Forest Inn, The Forest Inn, Hexworthy, PL20 6SD - Council voted to recommend approval of this application.

Refurbishment of Hexworthy Telephone Box (Defibrillator): work is now complete on the telephone box in Hexworthy which houses one of the Defibrillators in the Parish. Many hours of work have gone into repainting the outside and inside, replacing lighting, signage and re-instating the electrical supply. This has all been done by a local resident; volunteering their time and effort for the benefit of the



community.

The Parish owns and maintains two Defibrillators, the other can be found at the Visitor Centre in Postbridge.
