

The Parish Letter

God is now here

An atheist was writing an article for Christmas to prove that God did not exist. He wanted to finish his article with the sentence: 'God is nowhere!' Unfortunately, the sub editors made a mistake with the spacing and so the final sentence of his article read: 'God is now here!'

This is the heart of the Christmas good news: God coming to us in human form, as a vulnerable baby to a young woman called Mary. St John says: 'the Word became flesh and dwelt among us'. St Matthew retells the words of the prophet: 'the virgin shall conceive and bear a son and they shall name him Emmanuel' which means 'God is with us'. God is now here!

For many this is unbelievable. Surely if God was to reveal himself to us he would just rend the heavens and come down in power. However, God seems to work not by breaking into the world but by embracing the world from within. In Charles Wesley's carol, 'Hark the herald Angels sing', we sing the lines: 'Pleased as man with man to dwell, Jesus our Emmanuel'. Take away the traditional 'man' language and we see that it is saying that God delights to be human alongside human beings. This carol tells of a God who does not have to be lured down from heaven by us being very polite to him or behaving extra well. God can't help caring for the world that he has made. He doesn't have to be persuaded to be interested in us.

This can help when we pray. Approach God knowing that he is interested in us! Christmas teaches us to dispel the idea that God is essentially bored with us, removed from us and always in need of being kept sweet. He does not have to be persuaded to be on our side. As a former Archbishop of Canterbury said, 'You might as well try to persuade a waterfall to be wet.'

In Bethlehem, God comes to us in the weakness of a baby. A lifetime later, at Calvary, he appeals to us in the helplessness of a man nailed to a cross. In Jesus, God beckons to us not by force but by identifying with us. He wants us to recognise him and go to him.

God is now here. He values our humanity beyond all imagining. He shares our struggles as well as our joys. 'Pleased as man with man to dwell, Jesus our Emmanuel.' God is with us. God is for us. May you know the blessing of his presence this Christmas.

throughout; exposure and conservation of paintings discovered on the pillars of the Nave; rewiring with a new efficient, lighting system to show off the architectural features as well meeting health and safety requirements; a new sound system plus some other audio-visual options and replacement radiators with energy efficient valves. There may be some other minor works carried out around the organ.

Statutory notices about the work will be displayed in the church porch during December and anyone who has any questions is welcome to contact me. The work is likely to take between 4-6 months and will involve closing the church completely for a time. The work will be funded by investments held by the church specifically for the purpose for many years and grants from various bodies.

At long last I am confident that this time next year we will all be enjoying the beauty of this wonderful building at its best, as well as having a church that is equipped for the 21st century and the needs of those who use it

Covid reminder

While we will all hopefully celebrate Christmas 2021 as a time to be with loved ones, please remember *Test and Trace* still plays an essential part in reducing COVID-19 transmission and outbreaks.

The NHS Test and Trace programme is continuing to identify people who are known to have been in close proximity to anyone who has tested positive for coronavirus via a PCR test.

Locally the Devon team is helping to trace those close contacts and advise them on further steps to reduce risk to themselves and others. (Known contacts of people who test positive for COVID-19 no longer have to self-isolate - if they're fully vaccinated or aged under 18 years and six months.)

But, people can still catch coronavirus even if they are fully vaccinated, and spread it to others even before they show any symptoms.

If you are contacted by the Devon tracing team, or you receive a message from the Test and Trace app to tell you that you've been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID, please be extra cautious.

If you are fully vaccinated or under 18 years and six months, take a PCR test to see if you have also caught the virus and self-isolate if you test positive. If the PCR test result is negative, please look out for symptoms, continue to test regularly with lateral flow device tests, and follow the public health guidance around wearing face coverings, fresh air and good hand hygiene.

If you're traced as a contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 and you're not fully vaccinated, you are required to self-isolate because you are at greater risk of catching and passing on the virus.



Remembrance Observance in other countries

Following on from my article published in the November copy of "The Link" I thought it would be of interest to note how services and commemorations of those who lost their lives during World Wars were remembered in countries other than Britain.

Countries of the Commonwealth Canada, Australia, New Zealand honour their dead by remembering them on 11th November (Armistice Day) and wearing the Red Poppy.

In **Australia and New Zealand** an equally important remembrance is observed on 25th April every year (ANZAC Day). This date commemorates the heavy losses suffered by Australian and New Zealand forces when landing at Gallipoli in 1915.

In the **United States** the wearing of the Red Poppy happens on 11th November when the country observes Veterans Day. This day has been called "Veterans Day" since 1954 when congress changed the title from "Armistice Day".

Residents in the **United States** also commemorate those who died in the nations' wars on Memorial Day, the last Monday in May every year. Memorial Day, like Veterans Day, underwent a name change from Decoration Day, a day set aside for placing the American flag on the graves of military personnel in National Cemeteries.



In **France** the flower adopted to act as the remembrance flower is the cornflower. The cornflower grew in equal abundance to the Poppy on the battlefields of World War 1. The flower is known as **Le Bleuet** not only for its colour but also because the young French Army recruits who arrived at the front from 1915 onwards were called "les bleuets" - because of their new blue version of jackets, thus there was a personal French connection with the dainty blue flower. The flower is officially known as '*Bleuet de France*'.

In **Holland** "Dodenherdenking" Remembrance of the Dead is held annually on May 4th. It commemorates all civilians and members of the Armed Forces of the

Kingdom of the Netherlands who have died in wars and peacekeeping missions since the beginning of the Second World War.

In **Germany** the Commemoration is called "Volkstrauertag" (German for "people's day of mourning") and is commemorated two Sundays before the first day of Advent (Before Christmas). It commemorates members of the armed forces of all nations and civilians who died in armed conflicts to also include victims of violent oppression. First observed in modern form in 1952.



After a few hours of activity, you may become drained of energy and, like many others who are similarly afflicted, you can do very little else but rest. The medical advice is to do just that, rest. Trying to fight it just makes you feel worse. Resting, of course, is a natural part of God's creation, not just for humans but for all of nature.

As has been highlighted at last months world environmental conference, we need to change the way we live and the way we treat our surroundings to allow nature, and us, to rest. God built rest into his creation, a creation that includes human life as well as the countless plants, flowers, trees, insects, animals, fish, and birds that we share it with.

While resting, perhaps think about how much of the Old Testament, which was written around 2,500 years ago, is still so relevant for us today. For example, in Ecclesiastes: "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance, a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing, a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away, a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace".

If you need any support, because while we sometimes talk a lot about or concentrate on our physical health, it's important to remember the impact on our mental health too.

This COVID-19 emotional wellbeing helpline is being delivered by experienced, compassionate, professional, and friendly call handlers. The team offer up to an hour of supportive listening, providing you with space to talk about your situation and current experiences.
