

What will 2022 bring? As reported in December's Link, it will be the year that major restoration work will begin on the church. Some may ask "Why bother? Hardly anyone goes to church. Surely the land could be put to better use, like being developed for housing". Well, there are several answers to those comments.

On a practical level, the Church is a Grade1 listed building and therefore it would be virtually impossible to obtain permission to do anything with it. It also contains items of significant historical importance such as the rood screen, pulpit and even the ceiling of the Nave, which is a rare survivor of its type.

At a community level, it has been the centre of Holne for eight centuries. During this time, it has witnessed baptisms, weddings and funerals of local families, some of whom still either live here or have connections in the area. Then there are the links to famous figures such as the author Charles Kingsley and Archbishop Michael Ramsey.

It is true to say that the current regular congregation is relatively small but witness the 50+ people at a baptism in November 2021; the 50+ people who attend the Carol and Crib Services each year, in addition to the sizeable numbers who come to Remembrance and Easter Services. Then there are those who want to celebrate their marriage in church or say farewell to loved ones at a church funeral. Who would deny those individuals the opportunity to do those things in the presence of God?



The Two Edmunds

In the section of churchyard to the north of St Pancras Church, lying amongst a collection of "grave markers", is a stone commemorating the lives of twins, **Edmund Lyons**Radcliffe and Gilbert Courtney Radcliffe.

Today I would like to recount the story of one of those young men, Edmund Lyons Radcliffe and compare his passing to that of his father Edmund Willoughby Radcliffe, a name familiar to many from its inclusion on the Parish War Memorial.

Edmund and Giles were the twin sons of Edmund Willoughby Radcliffe of Bag Park, Widecombe. During my research of both father and son, a number of coincidences in the stories of the two men have been discovered.

Firstly, the same Christian name.

Then there is the fact that both joined the Armed forces at the end of a major world conflict. Edmund (senior) joined the Coldstream Guards in 1918, as soon as he was of age, but was still 'in training' when World War One ended. Edmund (Junior) joined the Scots Guards in 1945 but again saw no action before peace was declared and World War Two ended.

In 1950 Edmund (Junior) re-enlisted in the Oxford & Buckinghamshire Light Infantry which is the Regiment his father had joined when he went to war in 1940.

A further striking coincidence follows: Edmund (Senior) was transferred from the Ox & Bucks to The Parachute Regiment upon its formation and served with the 2nd Parachute Regiment in North Africa in 1943. Edmund (Junior) was transferred from the Ox & Bucks to the Durham Light Infantry in 1951, and in 1952 was posted to serve with the 'Durhams' as part of the British Commonwealth contingent in the War in Korea. (1950-1953).

Both men met their deaths whilst on active service. Edmund (Senior) in March 1943 in Tunisia and Edmund (Junior) posted "missing presumed killed" in Korea in April 1953. Edmund (senior) is commemorated in the CWGC cemetery at the Tabarka Ras Rajel War Cemetery in Tunisia, Edmund (Junior) is commemorated on the UN Wall of Remembrance, Pusan, Korea.

The Korean War is often referred to, (especially by the veterans of that war), as the "Forgotten War". Nearly 60,000 British combat troops saw action during the war both regular troops and National Servicemen. A total of 1100 British soldiers lost their lives during the conflict.






Wordsearch - Where did the Wise Men come from?


