

If you live or own a property that is next to any watercourse, including streams, culverts, leats & drains (other than a highway drain), or you have a watercourse that flows through your property, you are a 'riparian landowner' and you have 'riparian' rights and responsibilities which have been established in common law for many years. A riparian owner is responsible for accepting water from their upstream neighbour and transferring this, along with any existing drainage from their own property, freely, to their neighbour downstream. Responsibilities also include maintenance of the bed and banks of the watercourse and for clearing debris even if it did not originate from their land and removing obstructions.





'Winged' Commemoration



Residents at the western end of Buckfastleigh were able to witness a "fly past" in honour of an elderly resident during the afternoon of 3rd June. Lancaster Bomber PA 474 flew over to commemorate a local resident who was a Lancaster Pilot during the Second World War. The resident, accompanied by members of his family, was able to salute the aircraft as it overflew his residence. The plane flew over at a height of approximately 450 ft, and a speed of 116 knots.

Bomber PA 474 is the only airworthy Lancaster Bomber in Europe*. She is part of the Royal Air Force Battle of Britain Memorial Flight based at RAF Coningsby in Lincolnshire. PA 474 had also appeared at Dartmouth Jubilee celebrations during the same afternoon.

Earlier in her career the plane had appeared in the movie "Guns of Naverone".

News from the East Shallowford Trust



Plastic on the moors. I am guessing I am not the only person who rams on their breaks, leaps out of the car and tugs the flapping plastic from the gorse bushes or scoups it up where it has stuck in some rut. When walking with the children, we always carry a bag into which we stuff any malignant plastic, teaching the children practical care and responsibility, whilst clearing the mess at the same time

Yet, has our own large edifice of plastic become an eyesore or could it become a malign pest within the moors? Our polytunnel is what I mean. The small pieces of plastic that had to be trimmed off the day after a team of amazing volunteers tugged and hauled the plastic over the frame, were responsibly placed into the recycling bin. How long the plastic cover will last may depend on the enthusiasm of a pig or some sheep to get into the well fenced vegetable plot. It is certainly creating the most amazing micro-climate. A group of 27 children from Plymouth ran in to look at the tomato plants, pick strawberries and scour the beds for mushrooms. Within three minutes of discussing the importance of the Devil's Bit Scabious as the only food plant for the caterpillar of Marsh Fritillary Butterfly, all of them were wriggling out of any surplus clothing to reduce potential sweltering and trickles of sweat dripping down their backs. The poly tunnel certainly works!

One half of the structure is dedicated entirely to the Devil's Bit Scabious which is a pernickety little plant to say the least. Way back last year, we had a demonstration



from the aptly named 'Fern' from the Eden Project, who provided invaluable tricks on how to grow the wee marsh plants. Simple, you may think? Germination was tricky enough, but growth is something else! Success has been slow following what seemed like months of monitoring bare trays of seed in the cold of January and February. However, this month we have been the great beneficiaries of several extremely kind green fingered volunteers who have spent hours, gingerly transferring single plants into individual pots

for growth and transplanting.

It is hard not to think of them as triffids, they are so important to our project and work. As the weather warms, they seem to be growing before our eyes, which thankfully means we should have several thousand for planting out in September. The aim is to

plant them where there are gaps in the corridor of the Marsh Fritillary Butterfly, enabling a motorway of food in future years. The farmers have banded together to try and support this fussy little butterfly which is so symptomatic of much in life. Does one butterfly species matter? I asked one of the eleven year olds who came to the farm last week. He was a tough little chap, big shouldered, looked like he might be a boxer and sounded like one with a rough voice for his age. His eyebrows knit together and he scowled at me fiercely. 'Oh course it matters! It might be us one day and then who would look after us?' Eeek – I shut my mouth and was dumbstruck!!



Quite often we hear comments from adults that, 'We don't have time to discuss Climate Change, or recycling. We have to get through the curriculum, make sure they have enough food and find school uniforms for some.' But that is our point! If each child is given opportunities beyond filling their bellies, if their eyes are lifted and their worlds widened beyond the concrete jungle in which they have grown up, beyond filling

Vizion Zero South West Grant – Project to reduce livestock deaths and traffic incidents on the B3212 (Dousland to Princetown) Road.

Having been awarded a grant for just over £6,300 earlier in the year and working alongside a number of key stakeholders, this project is now reaching its conclusion. Hi-Viz collars have now been distributed to farmers grazing ponies and cattle on that stretch of moor. A new Vehicle Activated Speed Sign (VAS), has been delivered, to be installed at the Leeden Tor site, to allow for the current sign to be relocated to another position on the moor. DNPA and Devon CC Highways have agreed to make improvements to signage at both ends of this stretch of road. If these measures prove successful, Council is keen to secure additional funding to be able to expand the initiative to other roads within the Parish. An official launch of the initiative will take place on **24**th **June at 1000** in front of the Visitors Centre, Princetown.

Engaging Young People

Council is keen to gain a better understanding of what young people want from it, and to look at how Council can engage with young people to better address their needs within the Parish.
