Epistle

James 2:1-10, 14-17

My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favouritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, 'Have a seat here, please', while to the one who is poor you say, 'Stand there', or, 'Sit at my feet', have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts?

Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonoured the poor.

Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you?

You do well if you really fulfil the royal law according to the scripture, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it.

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill', and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

Gospel Reading

Mark 7:24-37

Jesus set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. He said to her, 'Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' But she answered him, 'Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs.' Then he said to her, 'For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter.' So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone. Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.'

And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, 'He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.'

The Apostles' Creed

Sermon

The letter that James wrote is scarily direct in describing a church where Jesus' values are being completely ignored! It's a timeless story.....

Once upon a time – our time, any time – there was a church community that had just been told it must raise some extra money. The roof has been leaking for a while, with some buckets in place to catch most of the drips.

People had got used to this, and weren't too worried, but the church architect has now insisted that urgent repair work must be done before it gets any worse. The work will cost more than there is in the bank. It's a rainy day!

Then on the very next Sunday two new people come to the church for the first time, one dirty and poor, the other rich and sophisticated.

One is hardly noticed, the other is greeted warmly.

Which of the new arrivals received the warm welcome?

That depends, doesn't it?

James is clearly writing to a church that singled out the rich man. They welcomed him enthusiastically. He loved the deference he was paid as he was led to the best pew, and he was ever so friendly in return. After the service they gave him an extra chocolate biscuit, and started enquiring how he made his money.

People were thinking "Isn't this wonderful – he's the answer to prayer. Isn't God's timing good! It feels as if he's been sent to us at our time of need. Let's be really nice to him and then he'll give us all the money needed for our roof."

But the poor man was ignored.

Would it have been better if the dirty, poor man was welcomed warmly and rich man ignored?

I don't think so. James tells us not to be partial, not to make assumptions, not to judge by appearances.

Riches or poverty are outwards signs that tell us very little about the inner person. How can someone's appearance tell us if they are generous or mean?

A poor person might be really generous, sharing what little he has, not bothering with possessions. Or he might be really lazy and mean, demanding charity and leading an idle, selfish life.

A rich person might be greedy and selfish, making his money by paying low wages and charging high interest, or he might have worked all his life to build an enterprise that is wonderful to work for and far exceeds any social obligations. Let's start again.

A rich man and a poor man came to church and they were both made very welcome. They were each asked where they would like to sit, someone gave them a service booklet and explained how the service would go.

They both joined in the act of worship and praise, thanksgiving and prayer, singing and silence, and both found a spiritual peace...

They'd found a community that valued them for who they were. It turned out that the poor man had been having a hard time, but was a skilled builder who turned his hand to sorting the roof.

The rich man enjoyed labouring up and down the scaffolding carrying the new tiles – they loved working together. All the able bodied in the church community joined in to help, within the constraints of health and safety, of course!

And soon the roof was fixed.

They'd enjoyed it so much that they wondered what they could do next?

They all agreed that there were many things they could do in the village around them. Doing odd jobs. Seeking out the hungry, the lonely, the sick, the miserable. Helping people connect with their neighbours and making them feel loved. It was as if God's love was flowing out of the church into all the area around.

And the illustration on the cover? What is that about? What do you think?

May we all find a way of expressing our faith through bringing more love to those around us, and sharing in the "good works" needed here in our community, helping to bring in God's Kingdom....
