Old Testament Lesson

Malachi 3.1-4

Sermon

One of the themes of Advent is that Jesus' coming was about changing our lives for the better. And today we have this theme emerging from John the Baptist crying out in the wilderness. He wants all his listeners to be happier, more joyful – released from the things that hold them back, and enabled to receive God's salvation.

However another theme of Advent can be that of judgement – at the end of time everyone will be judged to see if they are worthy to go to heaven. And if they are not, they will be punished with eternal damnation.

Together, these two themes can be summarised as the carrot and stick – approaches used to getting a stubborn donkey to move. Dangle a carrot, and if the donkey moves, give it to the donkey to reward it for good behaviour. Alternatively, use the stick to beat it into action.

Which is more effective? Which is at the heart of the Christian gospel?

Over the centuries Christians have often emphasised just one theme – the stick. In the Orkney Saga, written about the Vikings invading Orkney, there was a Christian Viking leader who offered the people of Orkney a straight choice – either you convert to Christianity, or your heads will be chopped off. They converted!

The dramatic and painful punishment of sinners is a common theme in mediaeval wall paintings and carvings, where the jaws of hell swallow-up all the sinners.

Such paintings would have been partly inspired by today's gospel reading where John the Baptist calls for repentance.

Repent or else is his cry – and it sounds like he is using it just like a stick – but he isn't, he is encouraging his listeners to seek forgiveness, to find a better life, to be freed from their sins.

Sadly, in many Christians – in particular those who are sure of a place in heaven – there is a streak of self-righteousness, relishing the idea of all those evil people being punished for their wickedness. Serve them right!

Indeed this is a common theme in society today – everyone who has committed a crime needs to be punished according to its severity.

Is the heart of Christianity a stick? I don't think so.

What I see in the gospels and throughout the New Testament, is people being drawn to God by his love. Jesus attracting people to God by showing he cares for them, and wanting to bring joy into their lives.

Paul seeing "love that overflows more and more with knowledge and full insight."

And even in Malachi, we see God's desire that "the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord".

The culmination of Advent with the birth, on Christmas Day, of an innocent, gentle baby, inspiring love in all those around him, has no hint of punishment or sticks, rather it is a celebration of deep and true love.

Love that overcomes all evil, and maps out a path for the salvation of the world.

A wonderful story of a child in a manger, Mary and Joseph, shepherds and kings, an ox and a donkey – and, of course, a carrot for the donkey!
