And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'

The Sermon

When Mary set off to visit Elizabeth, it sounds as though she was just bubbling with excitement. She couldn't wait to see her. She was dying to share the story that the angel had told her. She went with haste – a lovely phrase! Did she run? Or gallop on her donkey? Or just travel day and night? I wonder...

Or maybe it was just a matter of resisting the temptation to stop and chat to everyone she met on the road, telling them how excited she was about her baby. Particularly during lockdown, I found daily walks around the lanes and footpaths here were taking me twice as long as normal, because there were so many people to stop and chat with.

However she travelled, Mary speedily arrived, out of breath and excited.

She couldn't wait to see Elizabeth and share her good fortune with her. They were two very different ages – Elizabeth perhaps in her

sixties, Mary a teenager, but both pregnant, and both looking forward to the future that the angel had promised them.

I guess that for many of us, looking forward to the future is a key part of our happiness. Having something good to look forward to will always lift my mood. Holidays, Christmas, visits from friends, a planned meal out or a trip to a film or show. These are written large in the diaries, and I want the days to pass quickly so that they will arrive sooner...

But such happiness may turn out to be rather fragile. These days, with so many things being cancelled or uncertain, misery can come sneaking up rather than excitement.

Perhaps there's nothing more miserable than the cancellation of something we've been really looking forward to. Across the whole country, at present, I feel there's a sense of misery, as some cherished parts of Christmas are just evaporating, like a mirage vanishing. Christmas parties, meals out with friends and families, shows, events. The cancellation of such things feels really bad because we looked forward to them so much.

Misery is, however, a common enough theme in the bible, so we can learn some lessons from there. The prophet Micah, for example, was writing from exile at a time when the Israelites were all in exile, hundreds of miles from their familiar homes and countryside, bereft of all the security of a settled way of life and a familiar temple for worship. The people around him were miserable – they had nothing to look forward to.

However the prophet Micah had a vision of a brighter future, where Bethlehem would become the birth place of the "one who is to rule Jerusalem". Yet he knew it wouldn't be in his lifetime. He didn't promise Christmas next week, or even next year, rather it would be sometime in the distant future when Christmas came, when Jesus would be born.

A long-term prediction like this, that things will come together for good eventually, gives rise to a more stable emotional state than happiness, rather it brings hope.

A long-term hope that despite all the ups and downs of difficult times, like we are in now, God has a bigger picture where all will be well, where justice will prevail and good will win. Maybe not in our lifetime, but sooner of later.

The prophets' message was always of hope rather than happiness.

Mary had all sorts of hopes for her baby. However she would discover from Simeon when she took her new baby to the temple to be blessed, that Jesus would also bring her suffering, like a "sword piercing her soul" through his untimely death.

And yet Simeon gave her hope that Jesus would be the glory of the people of Israel!

Mary, during her life, rejoiced in her child and also suffered for her child. However she found that God was trustworthy, and so she placed all her trust in him. God was with her in her suffering, and helped her to be hopeful. And find peace.

We may feel that happiness is in short supply this Christmas, but our Christian faith promises us something deeper, more long-lasting – joy and hope brought to us once again by the baby in the stable.
