The blessing of the Palm crosses

Hosanna to the Son of David.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Behold your king comes to you, O Zion, meek and lowly, sitting upon an ass. Ride on in the cause of truth and for the sake of justice. Your throne is the throne of God, it endures for ever; and the sceptre of your kingdom is a righteous sceptre. You have loved righteousness and hated evil: therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of gladness above your fellows.

who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,
now and for ever.

The Gospel

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Glory to you, O Lord.

Luke 19.28-40

Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" just say this: "The Lord needs it." 'So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' They said, 'The Lord needs it.' Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying,

'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!'

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, order your disciples to stop.' He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.'

Sermon

Jesus is the centre of the Palm Sunday story, but I wonder if you noticed how his role changed during the day?

Firstly, at the beginning of our gospel reading we hear that "Jesus went on ahead."

Picture yourself as one of the disciples perhaps sitting around and chatting, talking to people in the crowd which had formed to listen to one of Jesus' parables. You knew that you were all generally heading for Jerusalem to be there in time for the Passover, and maybe someone had gone off to make some sandwiches.

And you saw the lonely figure of Jesus walking away by himself.

He must have looked an isolated figure, determined not to falter on the tasks ahead of him, and perhaps simply wanting to get on with it, to set off as soon as he could.

Maybe you've sometimes done the same thing? Have you ever set off, saying to yourself "I'll just get ahead, so as to be there in good time," perhaps feeling a bit piqued that others don't feel the same way as you, don't share your sense of urgency?

Although Luke wasn't one of the disciples (he became a Christian later as a pupil of St Paul), Jesus setting off alone was clearly remembered by those who had been there. Maybe they felt a bit ashamed and hurried after him?

Jesus was carrying an enormous burden of responsibility as a leader, which, as we know from the Garden of Gethsemane, weighed on him heavily. Seeing him going on alone seems to have really shocked the disciples, and they suddenly grew up.

So by the time that Jesus had reached the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem his disciples had caught up with him, and he was able to send two of them to fetch a colt for him to ride. They did this willingly, and thus Jesus was able to rest a while and await their coming back with the colt. Rather than being alone, he was now being well-supported by his friends.

And then, remarkably, the disciples took over responsibility for what happened next, and "set Jesus on the colt." They helped him into the saddle, presumably took the reins and then led the colt down the hill as he rode down from the Mount of Olives.

And then it wasn't just the disciples supporting him and cheering him on, it was the "whole multitude." The disciples were completely aligned again with their leader, and he, riding on a humble colt, aligned himself with his disciples. A brilliant example of mutual support.

It turned out to be a day of life-changing transitions:

- Jesus moving from being lonely and isolated, to being the centre of attention and being cheered and supported by all.
- The disciples rapidly moving from feeling comfortable about letting Jesus take all the responsibility, through perhaps guilt at being slow to follow him, to solicitude, caring for the most wonderful person they had ever known.
- The crowd realising that the man riding humbly on a colt was the same man who had done many "deeds of power that they had seen." So they took the opportunity to show their gratitude by cheering him all the way. They felt he was one of them, and yet also so very different.

I wonder if you've ever experienced any such life-changing transitions?

- How about on a wedding day, when the move is from fiancée to husband or wife!
- Maybe you were selected to be the captain of a team, which sounded great at first, but then you had to learn to motivate everyone else, and support them when they needed help.
- Perhaps when you were at the end of your tether, and your neighbour noticed, invited you in for a cup of tea, and then became a wonderful support.
- Perhaps when you first consciously said to yourself "I definitely do want to be a Christian and try to follow him where God leads me," maybe because you had got to know a Christian community, respected them and found that being with other Christians was a great support.
- Or maybe something on a much smaller scale, say when somebody smiles at you and it brightens up your day.

The very fact that we are here today, celebrating Jesus' amazing journey through the cheering crowd, is a sign in itself. As is the Palm Cross which, if you place it somewhere prominent at home, might prompt a life-changing conversation with someone else...

Of course these events are not of our making, but evidence of the workings of the Holy Spirit in us.
