

Scripture Reading

John 21.1-19

After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' They answered him, 'No.' He said to them, 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the lake. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.

When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead. When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?'

He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.'

A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?'

He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.'

He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?'

Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.'

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Talk

It's spring, and the lambs are happily playing in the fields. I love watching them. It all looks so natural as they skip around and play chase or "who can climb highest". And yet I know that the lambs are only flourishing because there's a shepherd keeping an eye on every field, every ewe, every sheep.

That's what shepherds do. They did it in Jesus' time, and they do it today. Care for their lambs and their sheep.

It was because Jesus cared for everyone he met, that he saw himself as a shepherd, and his followers as his sheep. He knew that people needed looking after as they struggled with illness, disability, hunger, poverty, injustice. The gospels are full of stories of Jesus' deep care and love.

Time and time again we see Jesus looking after the people around him, modelling good behaviour, being their shepherd.

So in today's reading, Jesus is encouraging Simon Peter to follow his example, and like a shepherd, take on responsibility for looking after Jesus' apostles, his flock.

Three times Jesus emphasises that he sees Simon's role as a shepherd:

- Feed my lambs
- Tend my sheep
- Feed my sheep

However the sheep are still Jesus' flock his because he says "Feed **my** sheep", it's just that Simon also needs to take responsibility for them as a shepherd takes responsibility for their sheep.

So what does a shepherd do for their sheep?

- Check they're ok
- Help them with lambing
- Bring food to them in winter
- Take them to new places
- Teach them how to behave
- Gather them back to the field when they have gone astray

Simon Peter had often gone astray - it wasn't long since he has denied Jesus three times at his trial. He had gone badly astray, and yet here was Jesus trusting him again fully, carefully bringing him back into the flock. I'm sure Simon's delight at seeing Jesus again, and his headlong dive into the sea to get to him first must have warmed Jesus' heart!

I wonder what it means to us to think of ourselves as sheep? How do we go astray? Look at the picture or cut-out sheep with your name on it...

"Going astray" sounds rather cuddly and nice, but because of that, it's easy to overlook that Jesus had an uncanny ability to cut through any selfsatisfaction in the people he was with, exposing any selfishness or meanness in their actions and lifestyle. Jesus woke people up to aspects of their behaviour that really, really needed challenging and changing, and he was passing this responsibility also on to Simon.

Jesus' sheep need to be different. He challenged people's behaviour and then, when they had started thinking about what was wrong in their lives, and appreciated that he was genuinely helping them to live free-er and happier lives, they wanted more.

They trusted him, and followed him because they knew his voice, even though they were unsure where he would lead them.

One by one the sheep became a flock. And this would continue under Simon Peter.

So we too are a flock – listening to Jesus, following him together, and enjoying the company and the journey.

And listening to Jesus' voice - however that comes to us -

How do we hear Jesus voice today?

- through gathering on a Sunday morning,
- by a sense that Jesus is with us in our thoughts and actions,
- by times of prayer and reflection,
- by reading about his life and teaching.

By whatever means, listening out for Jesus' calling, and following him as part of his flock is the only worthwhile way of living.

Now, in church, we'll gather our sheep into a flock here on the altar, giving thanks that we are all cared for by our shepherd, and ready to continue following his command to "Follow me."

Thank you Jesus.
