Then I called on the name of the LORD: 'O Lord, I pray, save my life!'



Matthew 16.21



No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did.'

Luke 22

When the hour came, he took his place at the table, and the apostles with him. Luke 24

They were at the tomb early this morning, and when they did not find his body there, they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him.' Again he went away for the second time and prayed, 'My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, your will be done.'

Again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. So leaving them again, he went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words.

Then he came to the disciples and said to them, 'Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Get up, let us be going. See, my betrayer is at hand.'
