CALL TO ACTION

SB 177 A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Chapter 5 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to government transparency and campaign finance, so as to provide for transparency **in foreign funded political activities within the state**; to require agents of hostile foreign principals and foreign supported political organizations to register with the State Ethics Commission House Second Readers *Status: 04/04/2025 - House Withdrawn, Recommitted*

PASS IT

SB 30 A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Article 1 of Chapter 7 of Title 31 and Article 1 of Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to regulation of hospitals and related institutions and the Georgia Composite Medical Board, respectively, so as to prohibit prescribing or **administering certain hormone therapies and puberty-blocking medications for certain purposes to minors**; to provide for definitions; to provide for limited exceptions; to provide for a remedy for a parent or guardian of a minor; House Second Readers

PASS IT

Senate passed SB 30 which would ban the use of puberty blockers on children. **RINO Sharon Cooper**, Chair of the Public and Community Health Committee, has **GUTTED SB 30 to now allow these puberty**

blockers to continue being given to kids. *Status: 04/04/2025 - House Withdrawn, Recommitted*

SB 120 A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Article 1 of Chapter 1 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions relative to education, so as to provide that public schools, local education agencies, and public postsecondary institutions shall not promote, support, or maintain any programs or activities that advocate for diversity, equity, and inclusion Senate Tabled WHY ?????

SB 52 A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Chapter 5 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to ad valorem taxation of property, so as to authorize certain local governing authorities to provide temporary tax relief from the taxes levied for the harvest or sale of standing timber in certain disaster areas House Second Readers STALLED GOOD BILL

PASS IT

SB 175 A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Article 1 of Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions regarding elections and primaries, so as to prohibit the use of ranked-choice voting

Status: 04/04/2025 - House Withdrawn, Recommitted

🗳️ SB 131 A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Chapter 10 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Georgia Board of Health Care Workforce, so as to provide for the establishment of the Georgia Health Care Professionals Data System; to provide for definitions; to provide

for collaboration with state licensing boards; to provide for a publicly accessible website; to provide for collection of data from state licensing boards; to provide for specified data; to provide for seeking of funding sources

HB 141 A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Code Section 48-13-14 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to levy on business or practitioner with location or office in more than one jurisdiction, allocating gross receipts, and limits on levies using criteria for taxation, so as to allow businesses and practitioners to provide affidavits of certified public accountants in lieu of tax returns INVITES FRAUD

Status: 04/02/2025 - Senate TabledTime

HB 268 **Government surveillance – without parents knowledge bad bill**

A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the O.C.G.A., relating to elementary and secondary education, so as to provide for the safety, health, and well-being of students and school communities; to create an Office of Safe Schools within the Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency; to provide technical assistance for local school systems to develop policies and procedures for their threat management teams; to develop a state-wide behavioral threat management operational process; to provide for definitions; to amend Code Section 16-11-37 of the O.C.G.A., relating to terroristic threats and acts and penalties, so as to provide for the offense of threatening the death of or serious injury to individuals who are or likely to be at school; to amend Article 4 of Chapter

18 of Title 50 of the O.C.G.A., relating to inspection of public records, so as to provide for an exemption

Status: 04/09/2025 - House Sent to Governor

BAD BILL VETO IT

HB 397 relating to elections and primaries generally, so as to allow municipalities to opt in to providing advance voting on Saturdays for municipal elections; to revise provisions related to the timelines for calling special elections and the dates on which special elections can be held; ...

Status: 03/28/2025 – *Status:* 04/02/2025 - Senate Passed/Adopted By Substitute

No. There should only be one day of in person voting.

HB-40 A BILL to be entitled an Act to amend Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to elections and primaries generally, so as to provide that the Secretary of State shall serve as chairperson of the State Election Board; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

THIS WILL GIVE RAFFENSPERGER THE
CHAIRPERSON'S CHAIR IN GEORGIA'S BOARD OF
ELECTIONS AND GIVES HIM THE ABOVE POWERS
INCLUDING "FOR OTHER PURPOSES". The State
Election Board needs to be independent.

Agency with respect to **pesticides;**
