Girls 7s Rugby


Getting Shammies Girls 7s up and running this year has been fantastic! It has been a year of building relationships with Canterbury, Balmain and Sydney Uni. Ivan Pomare (former Sydney Uni Development Officer) runs the combined Village clubs training sessions every week and we have seen the number of female Shammies steadily increase.

Early starters in Wave 1 of the Sizzling 7s comp were Jemima Zoud and Florence Ata playing for West Harbour on Saturdays as well as with Petersham in the regular u 10s comp on Sundays! Petersham 7s started in May with Wave 2. Hesta Ruelle, Lily Treharne and Isabella Gloria were our very first registered Petersham 7s girls playing in the Northern comp in a combined team with the Collaroy Cougars.

In June Newtown High School of the Performing Arts came on board with 4 Try Rugby sessions for years 7 & 9 girls. We hope this will be an annual exercise that will deepen our coverage of girl's rugby from Club into NHSPA and other local schools.

In June Sydney Uni Women's Rugby also came on board with 4 Try Rugby days. The Sydney Uni Lionesses Barbara Waddell (SU Women's President), Grace Hamilton (Wallaroo #8), Emily Chancellor (Wallaroo flanker), Jamie Barbour & Tilly Vaughan Fowler (Sydney Uni AON 7s) joined Ivan to take the girls through their drills. We are looking to strengthen the pathway from girls club 7s to women's rugby 7s with this relationship. In July, Sydney University Rugby showed their commitment to the 7s format by running a training camp during the July school holidays for girls and boys in the area.

By Wave 3 in August we had 4 new Shammies - Grace Dunn (u12s), Lucia Davies (u14s), Siara Ortolani (u14s) and Ruby O'Sullivan (u14s). Playing with Canterbury as an u14s team the girls played their very 1st game as Sydney Uni at Norwest against the Braided Bulls and Collaroy (now our opposition!).





The games were tough, the ground was hard, the beat box pumping (Go Carlo!) and the competition fierce but with Dunny & Ferg Duncan (Sydney Uni Reps Coordinator & dad to Davy from Canterbury) guiding them the girls played well and a new era was forged.

A full weekend tournament, Sydney City 7s, on a windy Malabar pitch followed on Bledisloe weekend. With guest players from Gordon & Sutherland, Ivan & Jordan (Canterbury) lead the u 12s & 2 x u 14s teams making it to the semi's and some players doubling up to the #PartofMore March at the Bledisloe at the end of Day 1. Jemima Zoud, in Shammies colours, was our star of the night bringing out the silverware for the Bledisloe opener.

A huge thank you to Ivan, David Haigh (Syd Uni Rugby President) & Kirsty Stevens (SU Events Manager) for their help in making this year a success. There are still a few more games to go including the Junior Nationals in October so stay tuned. Next year we are aiming for 3 full squads - u 12s, u 14s & u 16s. Junior Referee Initiative

Creating Better Opportunities in 2019

This year the Shammies produced our 1st junior referee from within our own junior's player ranks.

Harry Russell is a Shammies 100 club member and has played club rugby for the Shammies since 2009!
He toured New Zealand with his team in 2017 for the u13s Queenstown Festival of Rugby and this year played with the u14 Blues on Sundays as well as learning to be a junior rugby referee.

Harry completed a Refereeing Kids Rugby (RKR) course at the beginning of the season. This allowed him to referee teams that were 2 years below his age group. His first 4 games were under the stewardship of Richard Chen (Shammies u12 parent) who is a referee with the Sydney South Rugby Referees Association (SSRRA) and who gives our new referees the opportunity to cut their teeth on Saturdays at Queens Park Waverley and Sundays across Sydney.

In November this year, with the financial support of the SSRRA, the Shammies are running a full day Level 1 Foundation Course for our u14s and all interested mums and dads. We will also run an RKR half day course on the same day for all interested Shammies (including players under 13) in the mini's and junior's comps. 20 people will learn how to Referee Kids Rugby for 2019 (Mini's, Juniors & Girls 7s). All Referee registrations for 2019 will also be included under our new agreement with the SSRA for 2019 so get in quick!

Our goal is awe inspiring footy on the field through safe and informed game management, and improved conduct (on & off the field) through better knowledge of the Laws of the Game. RKR is the beginning of alternate pathways in Club Rugby for those players looking for a break from playing but wanting to use their existing rugby knowledge. RKR is also the beginning of the development of future careers in Refereeing.

A massive THANK YOU to the Sydney South Rugby Referees Association for supporting us with this initiative by funding our courses and referee rego fees in 2019 as well as funding the development of a Junior Referees Promotional Video for 2019. This is the time to get involved!

Season Highlight - In his first game of rugby Tommy lead the charge in defence tagging superbly & showing his teammates how it's done!








U6 Maroon Player Profiles

Dara Forrest



Lawson Gill



started to asses the best options for both him and the team.


Liam Waterworth
















U11 Age Group Report


Mannix Ung

Will has matured with the ball as the season progressed and is showing real grit and determination. He has huge commitment to the tackle and never takes a back step when going after the man with the ball.




Oscar Parsons


Lipina Ata
