

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



You would never have bet that a year like this could have happened. We were very prepared this year; player uniforms ordered in advance, new balls and gear, season calendar, a fantastic district "Try Rugby" day, Balmain trials held, Coaches and Managers all briefed and then boom! COVID-19 hit...

The pandemic surprised us all with the speed it hit and the far-reaching consequences it has had and continues to have on our community and Club. As a first year President of a local Junior Rugby Club I feel like I have just had a lifetime of experiences.

The overarching lesson it taught me however is the most important thing for our Club is to get as many of our kids on the field, having fun. If we continue to focus on that outcome, then the Club will continue to grow stronger.

And continue to grow we do. At COVID-19 shut down we had 220 registrations but at the close of the season we have 280 (up from 260 in 2019). This is the first year the Club has fielded teams from u6s all the way to u16s and hopefully soon we will realise our vision to create a pathway for players all the way to the Senior Shammies.

Something I am particularly proud of this year is, while there was no rugby to keep us busy, we used our time to help members of our community less fortunate than ourselves. Thank you to all the parent volunteers that helped clean and paint the hall of The Exodus Foundation in Ashfield as part of the #PlayforLives initiative. Without our support, they would have had to spend tens of thousands of dollars. This money has now gone straight back into direct support of the poor and homeless in our community.

There was some doubt in April if we would even get a season up and running and I am greatly appreciative of the support we have received from the competition organisers, Inner West Council, the Committee, coaches, managers and all volunteers. Without their support this short season would not have been as successful as it was. A special thank you to Angela Walker (our new Secretary and COVID-19 Manager) who kept us compliant with COVID-19 rules that seemed to change daily at one stage.

I feel incredibly privileged to be nominated and elected to the position of President this year. Special thanks to Adam Dunn, our outgoing president from the previous 5 years, who has left the club in a very strong position. His drive and enthusiasm for all things Shammies continues even though he has stepped away from the Committee.

Finally, we have some very special Committee members who have or are in the process of stepping down from the Committee. Thanks to Simon Teong (Treasurer), Kristin "Super K" Taylor (Registrar), Jo Bacic (Girls and Community), Briony Martin (Gear) and Sarah Pinchbeck (Projects). All these super stars have put so much into the Club and they can be very proud of their achievements.

A final word to our Sponsors who contribute so much to our Club. You have had a tough year. We appreciate all the support you have given over the years and it will not be forgotten. To all our members please support these local businesses as they have supported us.

Next year we will be back and more prepared than ever as a Club. We can expect a delayed start to the season next year as we will have a cross over season with the traditional summer sports. I would also expect for the u10s and up to see a continuation of the weekly draw changes early next year. There is so much uncertainly in our world right now so all we ask from all members is for your patience and flexibility.

Do you have any pre-game rituals?


Have a shower and wear my slides to the game!

SENSE RUGBY

This is the second year Sense Rugby has joined with Petersham Shammies. This year we had around 20 children accessing the programme and have a waitlist which is only limited by the number of staff we have to help run the programme. Sense Rugby is a rugby based Occupational Therapy programme. The focus of Sense Rugby is to provide a safe environment for children who have found it challenging to access mainstream sport. The majority of children who access Sense Rugby have a diagnosis of some description however the programme aims to work with the child and not the diagnosis in order to develop children's self regulation, attention/impulse control, social and physical skills. Aspects of the game of rugby such as pushing, pulling, squashing, crashing and teamwork make it a great avenue to facilitate these underlying capacities. The most important aspect of Sense Rugby is that children have fun and feel safe using their bodies in a group setting and want to come back. Once children feel safe, some may develop an interest or love of rugby and aim to transition into the main Shammies programme.

In 2020 we have taken some great steps to integrate this programme into the Shammies culture including JK running some drills with our older group, occasionally joining with some of the main rugby group, sharing some of Petersham's equipment and storage and also having Petersham shirts and caps handed out which was greatly treasured by the boys. The interest the Shammies' boys showed in what Sense Rugby is doing when we joined for drills really helped our team feel included!

There have been some wonderful stories this year. Some examples of our successes include:

- One boy's only goal from the family was that he would enjoy some form of after school sport as he disliked involvement in any group physical activity. The other day it was reported that he said "I don't like any sport..... except Sense Rugby." This boy is excited to come each week and is involved in all aspects of the programme.
- 2. Another mother indicated that her only goal for the programme was that her son could last through a group programme as he would always become overstimulated and shut down. He has been every week, is involved in all activities and his mother reports he loves the programme.

Next year we hope to increase our numbers again, change our times to be in line with the Shammies main training, be more involved and integrated into the Shammies and overall continue to provide a safe and fun place for children to explore and develop their life skills.

A special thanks to JK and all the Shammies for making us all feel so welcomed!!

Thank you to our tour sponsors and all the Shammies community that helped us...coming to our trivia night, buying our Tuesday night snags...and even buying an apron!



A BIT OF SHAMMIES HISTORY

A CLASSIC PHOTO of its time - Some of the most influential people in the 138-year history of Petersham Rugby.

Late 1930s - brothers Ken (left) Ron (centre) and Gordon McLean, "parading" along the promenade of Bondi Beach.

Gordon was President of PRUFC, Ron and Ken his, playing brothers. In 1940, all signed up to the war effort unfortunately, Gordon did not return, flying for the RAAF he was shot down over France and did not survive.

After WW2, to honour his brother Gordon, and in pursuit of his own rugby fanaticism, Ron McLean threw himself into the leadership of PRUFC - his Presidency lasted for 46 years - 1946 till 1992. In the early days he called upon his rugby and service-mates to help out - Bill Chapman [WW1], ex- Wallaby "Wild Bill" Cerutti, and his close friend and WW2 Warrant Officer Bernie Savers as PRUFC Vice-President, with his wife Betty as Patroness





Bernie Sayers at Camperdown 2018 - Up until his sad passing last year, Bernie was the oldest living Shammie and a wonderfully good bloke.

Ron McLean also made contact with the Headmaster of the rugby-playing, Fort Street Boy's High, and established a relationship lasting over 50 years, with Fort Street proving to be a nursery for PRUFC recruitment. Ron mixed with community-leaders, business-people, war-heroes and local politicians, he was in his element and proceeded to rebuild PRUFC from the 1946 season onwards.

To revitalise things after the war, Rugby HQ needed someone to help them promote the game in country NSW and interstate. They turned to McLean, who had shown he was a superb organiser and a rugby fanatic, hence started his lifetime journey of taking PRUFC to wherever rugby was played.

PETERSHAM JUNIORS RUGBY SEASON REPORT 2020

Ron, pictured here (far right), playing for NSW against Tasmania 1949.

First to Orange in 1946; Wellington [NSW] and Melbourne in '48; Hobart and Adelaide in 1949 and again in 1950.

He established PRUFC as the "Touring Club" and was swamped with offers to join those tours. Organising trips away soon became as important as the week to week running of PRUFC. Ron was soon planning tours to New Caledonia and New Zealand, anywhere and everywhere, then in 1967 - the first ever World Rugby Tour by any rugby club in world history.

Back to 1949, and Ron decided to move PRUFC's home ground from Petersham Oval to Marrickville Oval. He tendered £100 per season for a five-years playing-lease at Marrickville, outraging NSW Rugby and other sporting clubs in general -it set a very high precedent. Ron was given a dressing down by everybody and now had a problem - £100 was a huge amount in 1950 and PRUFC didn't have a hundred quid!

At that time every healthy Sydney male was in love with the well-known Tivoli Show Girl, Joan Fuzz. Joanie was a Petersham girl, went to Crystal Street High School for Girls; and her father had played for PRUFC before WW2. Joanie was "as wholesome as a Hartley Valley peach", recalled Bernie Sayers, in 2015.

In order to raise the £100, the PRUFC U19s convinced Joanie to star in a fund-raising concert at Petersham Town Hall, Joanie convinced many of her colleagues from The Tivoli Theatre to perform and Bernie and Betty Sayers MC'd the evening. The night was a great success, the money was raised and Ron McLean's immediate worries were over – back to planning the next season and the next tour to somewhere.

Keavy had a wonderful year of rugby. She loved the games, grew in confidence, and always did her best to run for the open spaces when she had the ball. A great little team player!




CHARLIE FUREY


to support fellow Shammies, he is in clear outs, attacking as a ball carrier or trying to take down opposition with tackles. Over time, his game will get better and better.

conversion on the buzzer to seal victory against Balmain was a highlight.




THOMAS NELSON

MADDOX TAMATOA-APERA


First year of rugby. Played in the forwards. Good strong running and improved around the breakdown as the year went on. Contributed well throughout the year in the Friday and Sunday

takes off with determination with the sole aim of evading their outside backs and stepping his way to the line. He is solid in defence and takes on the opposition with reckless abandon.




LARISSA DANIELS-MAIFEA


and getting his hands dirty. He loves getting that ball and going head on into the opposition.

EZEKIEL BARROS



From a family of many Shammies, Allen was a late arrival on the scene. Continues to develop his knowledge and understanding of the halfback role and game. One to watch for next season.




FLETCHER LAPTHORNE




JAKE MATTHEWS


LUCAS KOHEN

After warming into the season, this young lad started putting on one brilliant performance after another. His pick and go open running and commitment to




Ofa is always there to inspire the rest of his team with an amazing tackle busting run, a heavy tackle that traps the opposition behind the advantage line or even the

He is the quiet achiever in the team. A welcome addition to the squad from Canterbury, Luke was an absolute pleasure to have around. He is quiet and polite, but



TANE 'DON'T WORRY, I'LL STOP THEM' DOLAN -FULLBACK



FELIX SPRANGE




to him, he always attempts to inject himself into the action. With his slight frame we were concerned about his defence...which was not to be as he always made heroic tackles.

8 - Steven is a newcomer to the team with a rugby league background. He loves to clear the oval in front of him when he's running with the ball. He always puts our


team on the front foot over the advantage line. He doesn't mind carrying four players on his back over the try line.


SEB ARKO
