
CHA ANNUAL MEETING

Have you ever heard local "old timers" talk about the school they once attended that no longer exists, especially in the rural areas? Small one-room schools (and even larger ones) once dotted these greater Chico area, but gradually vanished as the Chico Unified School District consolidated their function into centralized operations. Speaker Dave Nopel will share materials from his Father's collection that illuminate the stories of this nearly-forgotten schools of Chico's past and how present schools evolved in the Post World War # era. If you have memories (and memorabilia) of some of the old schools, this is your chance to share.

A short business meeting will precede

the program, and refreshments will be available after the presentation.

State Historic resources commission visits chico

Chico Heritage Association was pleased to assist Senior City Planner Bob Summerville in "rolling out the red carpet" for the visit of the SHRC on January 19th & 20th by providing a trolley tour of Chico's Historic Neighborhoods, buildings and sites. In the 2 ½ hour tour we showed them historic buildings in the 2nd Street and Salem area, the Language Houses and nearby historic homes in the South of Campus Neighborhood; Diamond Match and the Barber Neighborhood; the Wright-Patrick House; the Northgraves-Bryant-Compton House; the Little Chapman Mansion area; AME Church; One-Mile Pool; Lee-Mansfield House; the Esplanade (homes, the Matador Motel, Sandy Gulch neighborhood, Chico Nut, and Enloe Hospital), the Mechoopda Cemetery and village area, Mansion Park and the Julia Morgan House (President's Mansion/Warrens Reception Center).

Many thanks to Adrienne Pustejovsky, Liz Stewart and John Gallardo for tour research and planning, and to Arlene Ward for adding Native American site information to the tour at several stops. Thanks also to Jon Couch for putting together at lightning speed a brochure with all the sites on it, to Paul Lieberum and Myles Pustejovsky for the job of removing plywood (in the pouring rain) from all the windows at the Wright-Patrick House, as well as all the crew waiting there to be the explainers. The Commissioners and Staff of the State Historic Preservation Office will remember their visit to Chico!




