

# MANY PRESERVATION PROJECTS UNDERWAY

There is a swell of Historic Preservation effort going on in and around Chico these days. The historic 1950's Thunderbird Motel neon sign is going to be saved; the Barber Neighborhood group is working to list the Barber Neighborhood as a National Historic District; and active subcommittee of the Avenues Neighborhood Association is beginning work on listing Mansion Park as a Historic Neighborhood, with other projects in the wind as well. Frances Farley continues his effort to save the Humbolt Road wagon ruts, and of course we are working to save the Old Patrick House (or the Wright-Patrick House). We are also continuing to monitor Chico State University's First Street Renovation Plan in order to make sure it does not threaten the seven historic faculty row houses on Rio Chico Way, which are currently slated for eventual demolition according to the University's Master Plan for future growth and development. Many, many individuals are working to preserve and/or restore the historic character of their homes and buildings, and, last but certainly not least, the City of Chico authorized staff to develop a Preservation Package that will greatly enhance preservation efforts in Chico. Included is a draft of a historic preservation ordinance for future consideration and hopefully approval, by the City Council, and updating the outdated Survey Historic Buildings that was begun over two decades ago. We'll try to keep you updated on these and other projects.



The roof of the Old Patrick House (Wright-Patrick House) ca. 1852 has reached the end of its life span! To preserve the integrity of the building over the coming winter, it is imperative that a new roof be installed this fall.
