The old Patrick Ranch House (aka the Wright-Patrick House) may be one of the oldest wood-frame farm houses remaining in the rural west. The earliest part of the home dates to 1852-53. Learn the history of this interesting home and its place in early settlement in the interior valleys of the west.

Presenters are Lucy Sperlin, Butte County Historical Society, and Darrell Deter, descendant of the Wright-Patrick family.

An update on current Chico Heritage activities, a short business meeting, and election of Board members will precede the talk. Refreshments will follow.

The Senator Theatre Tower

In 1999 the Senator Theatre tower began to lean, due to a degradation of its interior structure. The theatre's owners, United Artists, removed the tower in sections and was stored by the City. In October of 1999, Chico Heritage Association held a fundraiser, "Robin To The Rescue", to raise money towards the eventual restoration of the tower. The gala event included a showing at the Senator of the 1938 film "The Adventures of Robin Hood"--filmed to a large part here in Bidwell Park - and a dance at the Ballroom On Broadway in the historic IOOF/Odd Fellows Building, better known as "The Lee Pharmacy Building" (or to newcomers as "The Starbucks Building"!) The local chapter of the Building Council gave \$5,000 toward the tower!

The Senator Theatre was first opened in April of 1928 and was designed by the prestigious San Francisco firm of Miller & Pflueger. Its cost was then a huge amount of \$300,000. In the 1970's the building was portioned into four small theatres, but has since been returned to it's original single-theatre configuration. Eric Hart purchased the building, and interior and exterior renovations have taken place. The very slow and meticulous process of replicating the tower took much longer than anyone expected. The City was able to give Eric a low-interest loan for the tower's replacement. In fall of 2006 Chico Heritage Association was able to give Eric Hart a check for \$10,000 towards the costs of the replacement. We thank Eric for giving the community back its landmark. Not many people are building towers locally these days!

BARBER NEIGHBORHOOD

The Barber Neighborhood Association asked Chico Heritage to teach them how to research their home's history. John Gallardo and Liz Stewart held a mini-workshop on Janurary 27th at the Chico Branch Library. The library has wonderful collections of old city directories, newspaper clippings and published works. Everyone who came received a notebook and Kathleen Hillman's admonition to researchers: "Always write the date and place where you are, the name of the book or plan and NEVER write on both sides of the sheet of paper."

To hosting preservation conferences, workshops, and educational programs. (Possibly more neighborhood mini-workshops as we did for the Barber neighborhood).


