

Hall of Records Update



CHA board member Michael Magliari met on September 30 in Oroville with Butte County Clerk-Recorder Candace Grubbs for the latest on the Hall of Records project. Grubbs says the project is moving forward smoothly and is still on schedule for completion in July 2015.

Things have progressed quickly since Grubbs was reelected as Clerk-Recorder on June 3. Just one week later, on June 10, the Butte County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to give the final go-ahead to the long-awaited project. Then, exactly one month later, on July 10, Grubbs presided over an official groundbreaking ceremony at the project site. Actual construction commenced shortly thereafter. Concrete began to pour in mid-August, and the foundation slab is now complete.

Like everyone else in Butte County, Grubbs is hoping for rain to end the current drought, but not so much rain as to interfere with her construction schedule. Hopefully the weather will cooperate perfectly with her plans!



We milled it down to proper size, then primed it in preparation for replacing damaged and/or missing siding on the first floor. A short in the wiring at the house was repaired, and several members are working on updating the Primary Record of this historic site for the state Office of Historic Preservation.
