

At the May 12, 2022, WeROCC meeting, our speakers were Richard Hart, Board of Directors of Habitat for Humanity and Erica Rollinger from the Habitat for Humanity ReStore, Shelby, NC. They are baby lotion, baby wash, bottles, bottle brushes, burp cloths, diapers, diaper bags, hooded towels, nursing pads, pacifiers, receiving blankets, thermometers, wash cloths and wipes. They also had formula on the list, but there is a shortage in the US. If you would like to donate any of these items, bring them to our next WeROCC meeting on June 9, 2022.

The NC Republican Party State Convention was held in Greensboro, North Carolina on May 20-22, 2022. Several WeROCC members attended and WeROCC did purchase a vendor table to represent Cleveland County and sold both Trump towels and Handgun raffle tickets. It was a great deal of fun and we met Republicans from across the US who attended. It was an honor to be a delegate and to see NC Republicans work together to take back our country and to congratulate conservative wins both locally, and statewide up and down the ballot.





The North Carolina Federation of Republican Women held its Spring Board of Directors Meeting, which was attended by WeROCC President, Treasurer and past President.

WeROCC's 3rd fundraiser is in progress and will continue until October 2, 2022, ---Handgun Raffle. We have sold over 250 of the 1000 tickets to date. We encourage all members to pick up their tickets and sale them. This allows WeROCC to support both Republican Candidates and numerous community projects. The Cleveland County Chamber, AT&T, and the LeGrand Center hosted a Legislative Breakfast on May 23, 2022. Featured Speakers were Speaker of the House, Tim Moore, Senator, Ted Alexander, and Representative, Kelly Hastings. Highlights of priorities identified by Speaker of the House, Tim Moore in CC were Broadband to improve digital access to schools and work from home; transportation- bypass that is in progress is fully funded, which will open opportunities for increasing housing, jobs, etc. Senator Ted Alexander stated that military retirement pay would no longer be taxed, that CC now has a Public Defender's Office, money is being funneled into homeless shelters and a pilot program for firefighters who develop cancer; money for the water/sewer project. Also, the legislature has passed a Human Trafficking Bill of which the main aspect is to help women/children sold into the sex trade for money to get out of the lifestyle and expunge their record. The CC Sheriff's Department also received funding to stop child porn on the internet. Representative Kelly Hastings spoke about a project for interconnectivity with CC water and Cherryville water which will help to decrease situations brought on by drought; he spoke about voter integrity and identification; transportation- the Marion Street & highway 150 project (delayed due to DOT budget issues); and widening of I-85 into Cleveland County (being reprioritized).


