After falling in love with the Annapolis Valley they began searching for opportunities that would blend their love of camping and the outdoors with work and living that was more balanced with an emphasis on family life.

Enter the Upper Clemments Cottages and RV Park (UCCRVP). Christine is originally from Ontario and husband Raul from Batswana and Shri Lanka. A trained speech therapist Christine left Toronto and began work at a large commercial IT company where Raul also worked. Having already worked together they knew working together 24/7 as they do now at the cottage and RV park was in the cards. # A PERSON OF INTEREST



Most people know the Antiques in the Church shop in Clementsport, 1694 Highway 1, but you may not know its fascinating proprietor Leslie Langille. What an interesting man Leslie is, with such a rich and fascinating past. Leslie makes you feel welcome and very much at home the moment you enter his lovely shop. If you are new to the world of antiques no need to feel intimidated when you visit Leslie, he is relaxed, friendly and eager to share his knowledge and passion for antiques with you.

Leslie has lived in Clementsport for the past 22 years in a beautifully restored historical home which in part dates back to 1783. Leslie has been collecting antiques for 60 years and remembers the first antique piece of furniture he bought, a circa 1820 mahogany wall cabinet he paid thirty-five dollars. Since then he has operated antique galleries in Lunenburg, Block House in the old trading post, Granville Ferry and now in Clementsport. Leslie has been operating out of his current location since 2013. In addition to selling antiques he has restored old homes and operated them as B and B's.

While no longer running B n B's Leslie previously owned and operated the charming Boscawen Inn and Ashley House in Lunenburg and the Queen Anne and Hillsdale in Annapolis Royal. Leslie purchased the Queen Anne in 1989 and says this was his biggest restoration project.

Leslie's appreciation for antiques started when he was a child visiting his grandmothers house and seeing many beautiful things there. He believes that people are often drawn to things that are nostalgic and memories of things we saw and lived with when we were young. Antiques keep us in touch with the past and makes history come alive. It's fun thinking about who the people were who handled and treasured things that are now hundreds of years old. We are so fortunate to have Leslie here, his presence adds to the richness of our community

¼ cup light rum


½ cup heavy cream




